

Sir.

I have the honour to submit my Report on Crime for the year ended 30th September, 1960.

Hereafter in this Report the year ended 30th September, 1960, is referred to simply as "1960" and the year ended 30th September, 1959, is referred to as "1959".

PART I.

INDICTABLE OFFENCES

Total Number of Offences.

- (1) I am happy to be able to report that the returns of indictable crime, which increased steadily from the second half of 1955 up to 1959, showed a reduction in 1960.
- (2) The number of indictable crimes which were reported or became known to the Garda Siochána in 1960 was 15,375. The number in 1958 was 16,567 and the number in 1959 was 17,865. The 1960 return shows a reduction of 1,192 on the 1958 return and a reduction of 2,490 (or 14%) on the 1959 return.
- (3) Details of the crimes and information on the results of proceedings are given in Appendix A.

Detections.

- (4) Prosecutions were instituted in respect of 8,490 offences in 1950. In 768 other cases the offenders were detected, but for various reasons proceedings were not instituted. The total number of detections was therefore 9,258, or 60% of the crimes recorded. In 1959 the percentage of detections was 50%
- (5) The incidence of crimes and the percentages of detections during the years 1949 to 1960 inclusive are shown as a graph in Appendix B.

Incidence of Crime in Garda Divisions.

- (6) Appendix C gives the number of crimes recorded and detected in the 20 Garda divisions into which the State is divided. It gives similar information in respect of the Garda districts in which the cities of Cork, Limerick, Waterford and Galway are included.
- (7) The following table shows the number of offences recorded in the Dublin Metropolitan Division and in the rest of the State in the years 1959 and 1960.

- (8) You will note that there was a reduction of 2,475 crimes in the Dublin Metropolitan Division and a reduction of 15 crimes in the rest of the State. Despite the substantial reduction of crime in the Dublin Metropolitan Division, 57% of all the crimes recorded in the State in 1960 was recorded in that Division.
- (9) In the 19 divisions outside Dublin there were increases of crime in 7 divisions and reductions in 12, with a net reduction of 15 crimes for the 19 divisions. The divisions which showed increases of crime were Cork E., Donegal, Kerry, Leix-Offaly, Louth-Meath, Sligo-Leitrim and Tipperary. There was an increase of crime in Cork City, but there were reductions in the cities of Limerick, Waterford and Galway.

Analysis of Offences in four Groups.

(10) The number of indictable offences recorded and the number and percentage of detections in the four offence groups are shown in the following table with comparative figures for 1959.

Group I - Offences against the Person.

- (11) This group includes offences of Murder, Manslaughter, Wounding, Assault, Intimidation, Cruelty to and Abandoning Children and Sexual Offences.
- (12) The following table gives comparative figures of offences and detections in the years 1955 to 1960 inclusive:-

Murder - Of Persons aged above one Year.

(13) Two murders of persons aged above one year were recorded in 1960 and proceedings were instituted in both cases. In 1959 eight murders were recorded. Particulars of the two cases in 1960 are given in Appendix D.

Murder - Of Infants aged one year and under.

(14) One murder of Infant was recorded in 1960 particulars of which are given in Appendix D. No crime was recorded under this heading in 1959.

Infanticide.

(15) One crime of Infanticide was recorded in 1960. One crime was also recorded in 1959. Particulars of the 1960 case are given in Appendix D.

Attempt to Murder.

(16) Two crimes were recorded in 1960 as compared with one in 1959. Proceedings were instituted in both cases. Brief particulars are given in Appendix D.

Threats to Murder.

(17) No crime under this heading was recorded in 1960. One crime was recorded in 1959.

Manslaughter (other than traffic fatalities).

(18) Two crimes of Manslaughter (other than traffic fatalities) were recorded in 1960 - the same number as in 1959. Particulars of the 1960 cases are given in Appendix D.

Manslaughter (traffic fatalities).

(19) Forty-five offences of Manslaughter arising from traffic fatalities were recorded in 1960 as compared with 19 in 1959. The 1958 total was 42. Proceedings were instituted in 43 cases in 1960 and in one case a conviction was recorded. Thirteen cases are shown pending.

Woundings, Assaults, etc.

(20) The number of offences under this heading, recorded in 1960 was 337 as compared with 307 in 1959. Proceedings were instituted in 324 cases and in an additional 4 cases the offenders were detected but proceedings were not taken. Convictions were recorded in 237 cases and in a further 45 cases the charges were held proved and the Probation of Offenders Act applied. Twenty-three cases are shown pending.

Intimidation.

(21) Twenty-two offences of Intimidation were recorded in 1960, as compared with 13 in 1959. Proceedings were instituted in 11 cases and in a further case the offender was detected but no proceedings were taken.

Sexual Offences against Females.

(22) A total of 178 sexual offences against females was recorded in 1960 as compared with 171 in 1959. Proceedings were instituted in 156 cases and in an additional 9 cases the offenders were detected but proceedings were not taken. Convictions were recorded in 92 cases in 1960 and in a further 31 cases the charges were held proved and the Probation of Offenders Act applied. Fifteen cases are shown pending.

Group II - Offences against Property with Violence.

- (23) Included in this group are offences of Burglary, Housebreaking and related offences, Robbery and Malicious Injury to Property.
- (24) The number of offences recorded in the group in 1960 was 2,982, as compared with 3,824 in 1959. The decrease occurred mainly in Housebreaking offences.
- (25) Comparative figures of offences and proceedings in the years 1955 to 1960 are given in the following table.

Burglary and Housebreaking

- (26) The number of Burglary, Housebreaking and related offences (including attempts to break into houses and possession of housebreaking tools) recorded in 1960 was 2,756 as compared with 3,607 in 1959.
- (27) Comparative figures of offences and proceedings in the years 1955 to 1960 are given in the following table.

Robbery.

- Fifty-nine offences of Robbery and Assaults with intent to Rob were recorded in 1960 which is the same number as that recorded in 1959. Proceedings were instituted in 44 cases. Convictions were recorded in 36 cases and in a further 4 cases the charges were held proved and the Probation of Offenders Act applied.
- (29) Firearms were used in one case, particulars of which and of four other serious cases are given in Appendix E.

Arson and Other Malicious Injury to Property.

(30) The number of offences recorded under this reading in 1960 was 154. In 1959 the number of offences recorded was also 154. Offences of Arson numbered 82 in each of the years 1959 and 1960 and other Malicious Injuries to Property 72.

(31) Proceedings were instituted in 99 cases in 1960, convictions numbered 52 and in a further 24 cases the charges were held proved and the Probation of Offenders Act applied. Fourteen cases are shown pending.

Group III - Offences against Property with Violence.

- (32) Included in this group are offences of Larceny, Embezzlement, Obtaining Goods, etc. by False Pretences, Frauds and Receiving Stolen Goods.
- (33) The number of offences recorded in the group in 1960 was 11,470 as compared with 13,270 in 1959. The decrease of 1,800 is wholly accounted for in larcenies.
- (34) Proceedings were instituted in 5,570 cases and convictions were recorded in 2,403. In a further 2,451 cases the charges were held proved and the Probation of Offenders Act was applied. 630 cases are shown pending.
- (35) Comparative figures for all offences in Group III in the years 1955 to 1960 inclusive are given in the following table.

(37) Of the total larcenies recorded in 1960 the number recorded in the Dublin Metropolitan Division was 7281 or 68% as compared with 9294 or 73% of the total in 1959.

Embezz lement.

(38) Forty-eight offences of Embezzlement were recorded in 1960 as compared with 29 in 1959. Proceedings were instituted in 46 cases. Convictions were recorded in 24 cases and in an additional 16 cases the charges were held proved and the Probation Act was applied. 18 cases are shown pending.

Obtaining Goods, etc., by False Pretences.

(39) Four hundred and twenty-three offences of "False Pretences" were recorded in 1960 as compared with 282 in 1959. Proceedings were instituted in 342 cases. Convictions were recorded in 205 cases and in a further 52 cases the charges were held proved and the Probation of Offenders Act was applied.

Frauds.

(40) Fifty-one offences relating to Frauds were recorded in 1960 as compared with 85 in 1959. Proceedings were instituted in 47 cases. Convictions were recorded in 28 cases and in an additional 6 cases the charges were held proved and the Probation of Offenders Act was applied.

Receiving Stolen Goods.

(41) A total of 239 offences of Receiving Stolen Goods was recorded in 1960 as compared with 219 in 1959. Proceedings were taken in 225 cases. Convictions were recorded in 92 cases and in a further 83 the Probation Act was applied.

Group IV - Offences not included in other Groups.

- (42) Included in this group are offences of Forgery, Perjury, Bribery, Riot and Unlawful Assembly, Offences against Public Decency, Attempting to Commit Suicide, Offences under the Coinage Acts, the Treason Act, the Offences against the State Act and other indictable offences not included in Group I, II or III.
- (43) A total of 248 offences was recorded in the Group in 1960 as compared with 184 in 1959. Proceedings were instituted in 206 cases. There were 110 convictions and in a further 53 cases the Probation Act was applied.
- (44) Two hundred offences of Forgery and Uttering were recorded in 1960 as compared with 135 in 1959. Proceedings were instituted in 173 cases. There were 92 convictions and in a further 46 cases the charges were held proved and the Probation Act was applied.

Organised Violent Crime

- (45) Two organised crimes of violence were recorded in 1960, one of which was of an agrarian nature and the other political. In the year 1959 eight organised crimes of violence were recorded, seven of which were agrarian and one political.
- (46) The agrarian crime occurred in Co.Kerry where an explosion occurred at the Hall Door of a Mansion which shattered the door and a heavy limestone threshold and the glass in 13 windows. No person was injured. The political crime occurred in Co.Meath where members of the Garda who discovered a man on the roof of a Magazine were fired on when they called on the man to come down. No one was injured,

Value of Property stolen and recovered.

- (47) The total value of property recorded as stelen in 1960 was £162,128 as compared with £200,961 in 1959. The total value of property recovered in 1960 was £52,159 as compared with £54,767 in 1959.
- (48) In offences against property with violence (e.g. housebreakings) the value of property reported as stolen was £48,729 as compared with £81,613 in 1959. The value of property recovered in 1960 was £15,674 as compared with £21,108 in 1959.
- (49) In offences against property without violence (e.g. larcenies) the value of property reported as stolen in 1960 was £113,399 as compared with £119,348 in 1959, and the value of property recovered was £36,485 in 1960 and £33,658 in 1959.
- (50) The following table shows, in respect of the years 1955 to 1960 inclusive, the total numbers of offences in which property was stolen and the numbers of offences in which property of different values was stolen.

PART II

NON-INDICTABLE OFFENCES - PERSONS PROSECUTED.

Prosecutions.

(52) The number of persons prosecuted for non-indictable offences in 1960 was 102,795, as compared with 88,819 in 1959. The increase of 13,976 arose mainly from an increase of 14,215 prosecutions for offences under the Highway Acts. There was a decrease of 2,069 in prosecutions for offences under the Intoxicating Liquor Laws.

Convictions.

(53) The number of persons found guilty of offences charged was 94,653 or 92% of the number prosecuted. Of these, convictions were recorded against 77,639 and the charges against the remaining 17,014 were held proved and the Probation Act applied.

Details of Offences.

(54) Details of offences are given in Appendix F.

Assaults.

(56) A total of 1,255 persons were prosecuted for offences of Assault in 1960, as compared with 1,238 in 1959. The number found guilty was 1,018.

Dogs - Offences in relation to Licensing of.

(57) In 1960 the number of persons prosecuted for keeping unlicensed dogs was 4,090 as compared with 3,535 in 1959. The number found guilty in 1960 was 3,758.

School Attendance Act.

(58) The number of persons prosecuted in 1960 for offences under the School Attendance Act was 2,903 as compared with 2,962 in 1959. The number of persons found guilty in 1960 was 2,689.

Highway Acts, including Road Traffic Act and Road Transport Acts.

- (59) Prosecutions for offences under the Highway Acts in 1960 totalled 68,633 which is almost 67% of all prosecutions for the year. The number of prosecutions in 1959 was 54,418 or 61% of all prosecutions for that year. Prosecutions for road tax and driving licence offences in 1960 totalled 10,305 as compared with 8,945 in 1959, for offences against lighting regulations 28,548 as compared with 22,172 in 1959 and for dangerous and careless driving 3,280 as compared with 2,856 in 1959. Prosecutions for offences of driving or attempting to drive while drunk numbered 535 in 1960 and 479 in 1959.
- (60) Comparative figures for the years 1955 to 1960 in respect of total Highway Acts offences, offences against lighting regulations, driving or attempting to drive while drunk and dangerous and careless driving are given in the following tables.

Intoxicating Liquor Laws.

(61) Prosecutions for offences under the Intoxicating Liquor Laws totalled 14,818 in 1960 as compared with 16,887 in 1959. Of the prosecutions in 1960, 9,628 cr 65% were against persons illegally on licensed premises during closing hours and 3,180 or 21% were for offences of drunkenness. The number of prosecutions against licensed persons for offences against Closing Regulations was 1,522 or 10%

Malicious Damage to Property.

(64) The number of persons prosecuted in 1960 for offences of Malicious Damage to Property was 1,376 as compared with 1,269 in 1959. The number found guilty was 1,139 or 83%.

Revenue Laws.

(65) For offences under the Revenue Laws other than dog licensing offences a total of 837 persons were prosecuted in 1960 as compared with 608 in 1959.

Vagrancy Laws.

- (66) 768 persons were prosecuted in 1960 for offences under the Vagrancy Laws as compared with 754 in 1959.
- (67) For offences of "Begging" 473 persons were prosecuted in 1960 as compared with 499 in 1959.



MURDER, INFANTICIDE, ATTEMPTS TO MURDER, THREATS TO MURDER AND MANSLAUGHTER.

Particulars of Cases.

Murder -

(of Persons aged above one year) - 2 cases.

Co. Clare. On 22nd November, 1959, a 26 year old farmer was fatally stabbed in the head with a gimlet by a 33 year old neighbouring farmer as he stood in conversation with a young girl on the public road. The motive was jealousy. The offender was arrested and charged. At the Central Criminal Court he was convicted of Murder and was sentenced to death. Leave to appeal was refused.

Co. Cavan. On 19th December, 1959, a 29 year old labourer was shot and fatally wounded in the course of a dispute concerning a right of way, by a 78 year old farmer. The weapon used was a shot-gun. The injured man died on 3rd January, 1960. The offender was arrested on 21st December, 1959 and charged with Attempted Murder. While on remand on that charge he was transferred from prison to hospital as a seriously ill patient. He died in hospital on 18th August, 1960.

(Of Infants aged one year and under) - 1 case.

Dublin City. On 19th April, 1960, the dead body of a male infant was taken from the River Liffey. Two cloth bands were tied tightly around its neck. An inquest was held and a verdict of death from strangulation was recorded. No arrest has yet been made.

Infanticide (1 case)

Go. Offaly. Between the 21st April, 1960, and 24th April, 1960 a 26 year old woman gave birth to a female infant in her home and caused its death by tying a piece of cloth tightly around its neck. She concealed the body under her bed where it was found. She was arrested and charged with murder. At the District Court the charge was requeed to Infanticide of which she was convicted and was sentenced to twelve months imprisonment suspended on her entering into a bond to be of good behaviour and to keep the peace for two years.

Attempt to Murder (2 cases)

Co. Westmeath. On 23rd May,1960, a 45 year old housewife was assaulted in her home by a 33 year old ex-Mental Hospital patient, who struck her several blows on the head and body with a sweeping brush. She sustained injuries which caused her to be detained in hospital for some time. The assailant was arrested and was committed for trial on a charge of Attempted Murder. At the Central Criminal Court he was found to be insame and incapable of pleading and was ordered to be detained in the Central Asylum during the pleasure of the Government.

Co. Limerick. On 2nd October, 1960,a 22 year old shop assistant was attacked by her 20 year old fiance who beat her severely about the head and body and stabbed her with a knife. The assault arose out of an altercation between the parties. The girl received serious injuries and was detained for some time in hospital. The offender was arrested and was sent for trial on the charge of Attempted Murder. At the Central Criminal Court on 1st February, 1961, he was convicted and was sentenced to 2 years imprisonment, eighteen months of which was suspended on condition that he enter a personal bond to keep the peace for three years.

Manslaughter (2 cases)

Co. Tipperary. On 9th May, 1960, arising out of an altercation at a licensed premises, a 56 year old unmarried farmer was struck a blow of a clenched fist which felled him. His head struck heavily on the ground causing severe fracture of the skull and laceration of the brain which resulted in his death. His assailant, a 19 year old factory worker was arrested. He was sent for trial but at the Circuit Court he was found "Not Guilty" and was discharged.

Co. Mayo. On 31st May, 1960, as a result of a challenge to fight, a 24 year old labourer received severe facial injuries which resulted in his death. The injuries were inflicted, with his clenched fists, by a 22 year old farmer's son who was arrested and charged. At the Circuit Court he was convicted and was sentenced to nine months imprisonment with hard labour.

RCBBERY

Particulars of one case of Robbery with Firearms and four other serious cases.

With Firearms (1 case)

Co. Donegal. On 8th July, 1960, at 12.30 p.m. a man entered the sub-office of a Bank at Bundoran as the Manager was about to leave. He produced a revolver and ordered the Manager to drop a leather case which he had in his hand. He then ordered him into a room at the back of the office and struck him on the head with a sand-bag and after taking the sum of £715 from the case he escaped. The Manager was not seriously hurt. No arrest has been made.

Other Serious Cases (4)

Dublin City. On 22nd March, 1960, at 1.15 p.m. a Corporation Rent Official was attacked by two men shortly after he had left an Estate Rent Office. He received a blow on the head which felled him and a bag he was carrying which contained £329 was taken. The men escaped in a motor-car which was believed to have been previously stolen. Three men were arrested and charged. Two of the accused were sentenced to five years Penal Servitude and the third to three years Penal Servitude to run concurrently with sentences for other offences in each case. Five motor-cars and £600 were recovered from the accused men.

Dublin City. On 4th April, 1960, at 2.20 p.m. two men entered the premises of a Post Office on the pretence of buying cigarettes. They attacked the Postmistress, whom they tied up and assaulted with their fists when she resisted, and got away with £362. The offenders in the foregoing case were charged with the crime. They pleaded guilty and were sentenced as stated.

Dublin City. On 17th April, 1960, at about 2.20 p.m. a man who had entered the premises of a Post Office jumped over the grill and attacked the Postmistress. He was then joined by another man and they proceeded to tie up the Postmistress who was beaten about the face with their fists. When told by the Postmistress that her husband was at the back talking to a policeman they left hurriedly taking about £60 from the cash desk. A stolen car was later found in the vicinity. The accused in the foregoing cases were charged with this crime. They pleaded guilty and were sentenced as stated.

Dublin City. On 27th April, 1960, at about 2 p.m. two men entered a private residence. They tied up and beat a housekeeper and after searching the house made off with money and property valued at £193. The accused in the foregoing cases were charged with this crime also. They pleaded guilty and were sentenced as stated.
