Sir,

I have the honour to submit my Report on Crime for the year ended September, 30th, 1962.

Hereafter in this report the year ended September 30th, 1962, is referred to simply as "1962" and the year ended September, 30th, 1961, is referred to as "1961".

#### PART I.

#### INDICTABLE OFFENCES.

## Total number of Offences.

- (1) The number of indictable offences which were reported or became known to the Garda in 1962 was 15,307. The number in 1961 was 14,818 and the number in 1960 was 15,375. The 1962 total shows an increase of 489 on the 1961 return and a reduction of 68 on the 1960 return.
- (2) Details of the crimes and information on the results of proceedings are given in Appendix A.

#### Detections.

- Proceedings were instituted in respect of 9,370 offences in 1962. In 759 other cases the offenders were detected but for various reasons proceedings were not instituted. In most of those cases the offences were taken into consideration by the Courts in dealing with offenders on other charges. The total number of offences detected was therefore 10,129 or 66% of the offences recorded. In 1961 the percentage was also 66% and in 1960 was 60%
- (4) The incidence of indictable offences and detections in the years 1952 to 1962 inclusive, are shown as a graph in Appendix B.

### Incidence of Crime in Garda Divisions.

- The numbers of crimes recorded and detected in each of the 20 Garda Divisions into which the State is divided are given in Appendix C. Similar information in respect of the Garda Districts in which the Cities of Cork, Limerick, Waterford and Galway are included, is also given there.
- (6) The following table shows the number of offences recorded in the Dublin Metropolitan Division and in the rest of the State in the years 1961 and 1962.

The increase in crime in the country excluding the Dublin Metropolitan Division is spread over 15 of the 19 Divisions, the highest being Roscommon/Galway E.R. increase of 78 crimes - 54%: Sligo/Leitrim, increase of 42 crimes - 49%: Cavan/Monaghan, increase of 63 crimes - 28%: Longford/Westmeath, increase of 43 crimes - 21%: Limerick, increase of 90 crimes - 17% and Wexford, increase of 40 crimes - 17%. The increase in Limerick is mainly due to an increase of 85 or 23% in Limerick City District. There is little change in the numbers of crimes recorded in the City districts of Cork, Waterford and Galway as compared with the numbers in 1961.

(8) The number of indictable offences recorded and the number and percentage of detections in the four offence groups are shown in the following table with comparative figures for 1961.

# Group I - Offences against the Person.

- (9) This group includes offences of Murder, Manslaughter, Wounding, Assault, Intimidation, Cruelty to and Abandoning Children and Sexual Offences.
- (10) The following table gives comparative figures of offences and detections in the years 1957 to 1962, inclusive:-

# Murder of Persons aged above one year.

(11) Two murders of persons aged above one year were recorded in 1962 and proceedings were instituted in both cases. Eight murders were recorded in 1961. Brief particulars of the two cases in 1962 are given in Appendix D.

# Murder - of Infants aged one year and under.

(12) One murder of infant was recorded in 1962 particulars of which are given in Appendix D. Two crimes were recorded in 1961.

#### Infanticide.

(13) Three crimes of Infanticide were recorded in 1962 as compared with one crime in 1961. Brief particulars of the 1962 crimes are given in Appendix D.

#### Attempt to Murder.

(14) Four crimes were recorded under this heading in 1962, brief particulars of which are given in Appendix D. One crime was recorded in 1961.

## Threats to Murder.

One crime of Threatening to Murder was recorded in 1962. Two crimes of this nature were recorded in 1961. Brief particulars of the 1962 crime are given in Appendix D.

# Manslaughter (other than Traffic Fatalities)

(16) Six crimes were recorded under this heading for the year 1962 as compared with two crimes in 1961. Brief particulars of the 1962 cases are given in Appendix D.

# Traffic Fatalities (Manslaughter and Dangerous Driving causing death)

(17) Three persons were charged with manslaughter arising out of/

out of traffic fatalities and 99 persons were charged with dangerous driving causing death. Convictions were recorded in 9 cases and 19 cases are shown pending. The offence of dangerous driving causing death is a new offence created by section 53 of the Road Traffic Act, 1961.

# Dangerous Driving - causing serious bodily harm.

(18) One hundred and four persons were charged with dangerous driving causing serious bodily harm. Convictions were recorded in 10 cases and 23 cases are shown pending. This Offence is a new one created by section 53 of the Road Traffic Act, 1961.

### Wounding, Assault, etc.

(19) A total of 396 crimes of Wounding, Assault, etc. was recorded in 1962 as compared with 406 in 1961. Proceedings were instituted in 382 cases in 1962. Convictions were recorded in 308 cases and in a further 31 cases the charges were held proved and the Probation of Offenders Act applied.

#### Intimidation.

(20) Nine offences of Intimidation were recorded in 1962 as compared with 12 offences in 1961. Proceedings were taken in 2 cases and in one other case the offender was detected but proceedings were not instituted.

## Sexual Offences against Females.

A total of 151 sexual offences against females was recorded for 1962 which is 3 more than the number for 1961. Proceedings were taken in 115 cases in 1962 and in a further 12 cases the offenders were detected but no proceedings were taken. Convictions were recorded in 70 cases and in a further 17 cases the charges were held proved and the Probation of Offenders Act applied. 25 cases are shown pending.

# Group II - Offences against Property with Violence.

- (22) Included in this group are offences of Burglary, Housebreaking and related offences, Robbery and Malicious Injury to Property.
- (23) The number of offences recorded in the group in 1962 was 3,466 as compared with 3,186 in 1961. The increase occurred in Housebreaking offences.
- (24) Comparative figures of offences in this group and proceedings in the years 1957 to 1962 inclusive are given in the following table.

# Burglary and Housebreaking.

- The number of offences of Burglary, Housebreaking and related offences (including attempts to break into houses, shops etc. and possession of housebreaking tools) recorded for 1962 was 3,289 as compared with 3,018 in 1961. Proceedings were commenced in 2,286 cases in 1962 and in a further 174 cases the offenders were detected but no proceedings were taken, giving a total of 2,460 detections (75%).
- (26) Comparative figures of offences and proceedings in the years 1957 to 1962 are given in the following table.

#### Robbery.

- Thirty-nine offences of Robbery and Assault with Intent to rob were recorded in 1962 as compared with 42 in 1961. Proceedings were commenced in 30 cases. Convictions were recorded in 21 cases and in a further five cases the charges were held proved and the Probation of Offenders Act applied. Three cases are shown pending. Firearms were not used in the commission of any offence in 1962. There were two armed robberies in 1961.
- (28) Brief particulars of some of the more serious robberies in 1962 are given in Appendix E.

## Arson and other Malicious Injury to Property.

- (29) The number of offences recorded under this heading in 1962 was 135. Offences of Arson numbered 71. In 1961 the total of offences recorded was 121 of which 56 were offences of Arson.
- (30) Proceedings were commenced in 86 cases in 1962.
  Convictions were recorded in 11 cases and in a further 12 cases the charges were held proved and the Probation of Offenders Act applied. Fourteen cases are shown pending.

# Group III - Offences against Property without Violence.

- (31) Included in this group are offences of Larceny, Embezzlement, Obtaining Goods, etc. by False Pretences, Frauds and Receiving Stolen Goods.
- (32) The number of offences recorded in the group in 1962 was 10,666 as compared with 10,623 in 1961.
- (33) Proceedings were commenced in 5,914 cases in 1962 and in a further 526 cases the offenders were detected

but no proceedings were taken, giving a total of 6,440 detections or 60%. The number of detections in 1961 was 6,473 or 61%. Convictions in 1962 numbered 2,892 and in a further 2,436 cases the charges were held proved and the Probation of Offenders Act applied. A total of 689 cases are shown pending.

#### Embezzlement

(37) Fifty-five offences of Embezzlement were recorded in 1962 as compared with 62 in 1961. Proceedings were commenced in 51 cases. Convictions were recorded in 14 cases and in a further 31 cases the charges were held proved and the Probation of Offenders Act applied.

# Obtaining Goods, etc. by False Pretences.

(38) Offences of "False Pretences" numbered 410 in 1962 as compared with 378 in 1961. Proceedings were commenced in 308 cases and in an additional 50 cases the offenders were detected but no proceedings are shown. Convictions were recorded in 220 cases in 1962 and in a further 42 cases the charges were held proved and the Probation of Offenders Act applied.

## Frauds.

(39) There was an increase of 48 or 86% in the number of "Frauds" recorded in 1962, the total offences being 104 as compared with 56 in 1961. In the Dublin Metropolitan Division 52 offences were recorded in 1962 as compared with 28 in 1961. Proceedings were commenced in 92 cases in 1962 and in a further seven cases the offenders were detected but no proceedings are shown. Convictions in 1962 numbered 43 and in an additional 22 cases the charges were held proved and the Probation Act applied.

#### Receiving Stolen Goods.

(40) The number of offences of Receiving Stolen Goods in 1962 was 280. The number in 1961 was 266. Proceedings were commenced in 265 cases. Convictions numbered 105 and in a further 102 cases the charges were held proved and the Probation of Offenders Act applied.

#### Group IV - Offences not included in other Groups.

- (41) Included in this group are offences of Forgery and Uttering, Perjury, Bribery, Riot and Unlawful Assembly, Offences against the Coinage Acts, Offences against Public Decency, Attempting to Commit Suicide, Offences against the Treason Act and the Offences against the State Act and other indictable offences not included in Group I, II or III.
- (42) The number of offences recorded in this group in 1962 was 290 as compared with 308 in 1961. Proceedings were commenced in 243 cases in 1962. Convictions numbered 187 and in an additional 55 cases the charges were held proved and the Probation of Offenders Act was applied.
- (43) A total of 230 offences of Forgery and Uttering was recorded in 1962 as compared with 255 in 1961. Proceedings were commenced in 230 cases in 1962. Convictions were recorded in 162 cases and in a further 46 cases the charges were held proved and the Probation of Offenders Act applied.

## Organised Crimes of Violence.

(44) No organised crime of violence was recorded in 1962 nor was any such crime recorded in 1961.

# Value of Property Stolen and Recovered.

- The total value of property reported as stolen in 1962 was £230,312 as compared with £161,178 in 1961. The value of property recovered in 1962 was £59,967 as compared with £55,612 in 1961.
- (46) In offences against property with violence (e.g. Housebreakings) the value of property reported as stolen in 1962 was £108,190 as compared with £61,005 in 1961. The value of property recovered in 1962 was £20,909 as compared with £16,764 in 1961.
- In offences against property without violence (e,g. Larcenies) the value of property reported as stolen in 1962 was £122,122 as compared with £100,173 in 1961. The value of property recovered was £39,058 as compared with £38,848 in 1961.
- (48) The following table shows in respect of the years 1957 to 1962 inclusive, the total numbers of offences in which property was stolen and the numbers of offences in which property of different values was stolen.

## Prosecutions.

- (50) The number of persons prosecuted for non-indictable offences in 1962 was 105,189 as compared with 104,057 in 1961.

# Convictions.

(52) The number of persons found guilty of offences charged in 1962 was 95,912 or 91% of the number prosecuted. Of this number, convictions were recorded against 77,668 and the charges against the remaining 18,244 were held proved and the Probation of Offenders Act applied.

#### Assaults.

(55) A total of 1,428 persons were prosecuted for Assaults in 1962 as compared with 1,373 in 1961. The number found guilty was 1,180.

### Dogs - Offences in relation to licensing of.

(56) For offences of keeping unlicensed dogs the number of persons prosecuted in 1962 was 4,970 as compared with 3,322 in 1961. The number found guilty in 1962 was 4,737.

#### School Attendance Act.

(57) The number of persons prosecuted for offences against the School Attendance Act, in 1962, was 3,277 as compared with 3,219 in 1961. The number found guilty in 1962 was 3,064.

# Highway Acts - including Road Traffic Act and Road Transport Acts.

- The number of persons prosecuted for offences under the Highway Acts, in 1962, was 77,203 which is almost 75% of all prosecutions for the year. The number of prosecutions in 1961 was 77,834 which was also 75% of prosecutions in that year. Prosecutions for offences against Lighting Regulations in 1962 totalled 27,428 as compared with 32,298 in 1961, for offences relating to Road Tax and Driving Licences 11,193 as compared with 10,639 in 1961, for Dangerous and Careless driving, 4233 as compared with 3,772 in 1961 and for offences of driving or attempting to drive while drunk, 912 as compared with 651 in 1961.
- (59) Comparative figures for the years 1957 to 1962 in respect of total Highway Act Offences, Offences against Lighting Regulations, Offences of driving or attempting to drive while drunk and Dangerous and Carcless Driving are given in the following tables.

# Intoxicating Liquor Laws.

Prosecutions for offences under the Intoxicating Liquor Laws totalled 7,737 in 1962 as compared with 8,256 in 1961. The decrease is shown mainly in prosecutions against persons found on licensed premises during closing hours, for which offence 3,465 persons were prosecuted in 1962 as compared with 3,852 in 1961. For offences of drunkenness a total of 3,170 persons were prosecuted in 1962 as compared with 3,094 persons in 1961 and prosecutions against licensed persons or their servants for offences against Closing Regulations numbered 713 in 1962 as compared with 910 in 1961.

# Malicious Damage to Property.

(63) The number of persons prosecuted in 1962 for offences of Malicious Damage to property was 1,463 as compared with 1,366 in 1961. The number found guilty was 1,222 or almost 84%.

## Revenue Laws.

-

(64) For offences under the Revenue Laws - other than Dog Licensing Offences - a total of 865 persons were prosecuted in 1962 as compared with 776 in 1961. The number found guilty was 798 or 92%.

# Vagrancy Laws.

- (65) For offences against the Vagrancy Laws, 935 persons were prosecuted in 1962 as compared with 833 in 1961. The number found guilty was 828 or 89%.
- (66) For offences of Begging, 496 persons were prosecuted in 1962 as compared with 509 in 1961. A total of 455 persons or 92% were found guilty.



# Murder, Infanticide, Attempts to Murder, Threats to Murder and Manslaughter.

### Particulars of Cases.

# Murder - (of Persons aged above one year) - 2 Cases.

Co. Wexford - On 14th November, 1961, the dead body of a 66 year old widow was found lying in a pool of blood on her kitchen floor. Her head bore extensive injuries. A broken chair and a large metal pot lay beside the body. A 28 year old labourer was arrested and charged with the crime. He was found guilty but insane and was ordered to be detained during the pleasure of the Government.

Co. Galway - On 29th April, 1962, a 61 year old farmer died in his home from a fractured skull which was sustained in a domestic quarrel with his wife. The latter was charged with murder. She was found "Not Guilty".

# (of infants aged one year and under) - One Case.

<u>Co. Waterford</u> - On 19th July, 1962, the dead body of a male infant was found on the strand near Tramore. A post-mortem examination revealed that death was caused by strangulation. No one has been made amenable.

# <u>Infanticide</u> - <u>Three Cases</u>.

<u>Dublin Metropolitan</u> - On 19th April, 1962, the dead body of a female infant, bearing extensive injuries, was found in a quarry. A 25 year old newsvendor was arrested and charged with murder. She was found guilty of Infanticide and was released on Probation.

Co. Cork - On 24th June, 1962, a 19 year old domestic servant was found in her bedroom with the dead body of a male infant, wrapped in a bedside rug, in her arms. A Post-mortem examination of the body revealed that death was caused by manual strangulation. The girl was charged with murder. She was sent for trial for Infanticide and was found "Not Guilty".

Co. Cork - On 12th July, 1962, a 17½ year old girl gave birth to a female infant at her parents home. The body of the infant was later found in a hedge outside the house. Death was caused by asphyxiation. The girl was charged with murder. She was sent for trial for Infanticide. The case is shown pending.

# Attempt to Murder - Four Cases.

<u>Co. Longford</u> - On 26th December, 1961, two shots from a .22 rifle were fired at a 75 year old farmer while he was tending his livestock. He was not injured. A 40 year old neighbouring farmer was arrested and charged. He was later committed to a Mental Hospital.

Dublin Metropolitan - On 26th April, 1962, a 60 year old labourer was found in his home suffering from severe head injuries and stab wounds. His 16 year old son was arrested and charged. He was found unfit to plead and was committed to a Mental Hospital.

<u>Co. Cork</u> - On 3rd May, 1962, an 86 year old widow was attacked while in bed in her home and received severe injuries to her head and fractures of both hands and forearms. Her son, aged 53 years, unemployed, was arrested and charged. He was later committed to a Mental Hospital.

Co. Limerick - On 6th July, 1962, a 40 year old unemployed man attempted to kill two of his children, aged 4½ years and 2½ years and to commit suicide by locking himself and the children in the kitchen of their home and turning on the gas stove. The alarm was raised by an elder child. The kitchen was broken open and all three were taken out and removed to hospital. The father was unconscious and on recovery he was committed to a Mental Hospital. He was subsequently charged with attempting to murder the children and attempting to commit suicide. At the Central Criminal Court he was found not guilty and was discharged.

# Threats to Murder - One Case.

<u>Co. Galway</u> - During the investigation of a crime which was committed in 1962, the Gardai received information for the first time of the commission of a crime in 1957.

About midnight on a date unknown in May, 1957, seven men entered the residence of a 36 year old farmer and threatened him with death if he put sheep grazing on lands which he had rented, by tender, from the Galway Corporation. As a result of the threat he declined to take the lands. A 40 year old farmer has been charged with the crime. He is awaiting trial at the Central Criminal Court.

# Manslaughter - (Other than Traffic Fatalities) - Six Cases.

<u>Co. Cork</u> - On 1st September, 1961, a 35 year old labourer was fatally injured when the machinery of a Combine Harvester which he was cleaning was put in motion by the driver. The Attorney General directed a prosecution and the 23 year old driver was charged. Informations were refused.

Co. Kilkenny - On 7th September, 1961, a 75 year old farmer was involved in a brawl at a fair. He was struck a blow in the face by a 33 year old neighbouring farmer and felled to the ground. He sustained a fracture of the skull which resulted in his death. The assailant was arrested and charged. He was found "Not Guilty".

Co. Monaghan - On 12th March, 1962, an argument arose between a 57 year old farmer and his son, aged 16½ years, concerning the sale of hay. In the course of the dispute the youth took a shot gun from the house and fired a shot at his father with fatal consequence. The boy was arrested and charged with murder. He was found guilty of Manslaughter and was sentenced to seven years detention.

Co. Kilkenny - On 3rd May, 1962, a 12 year old schoolboy was fatally injured when air was released from an air compressor, into his rectum by two men at a garage. The boy died on 22nd May, 1962. The two garage-hands aged 35 years and 18½ years respectively were arrested and charged with murder. On this charge informations were refused and a charge of Manslaughter substituted by the Court. Both accused were sent for trial. At the Circuit Court they were found "Not Guilty".

Co. Limerick - On 19th May, 1962, during an altercation on a public street a 32 year old labourer received fatal injuries when he was knocked down by a blow from a 26 year old labourer. He sustained severe fracture of his skull and died on the following day. The men had previously been on the most friendly terms. The assailant was charged with Manslaughter. He was sentenced to 12 months imprisonment.

<u>Dublin Metropolitan</u> - On 1st September, 1962, in the course of an argument in a public street, a 42 year old labourer received severe head injuries when he was felled by a blow from a 39 year old labourer. He died on 3rd September, 1962. The assailant was charged with Manslaughter. Informations were refused.

#### Robbery.

# Particulars of some of the more serious cases of Robbery.

Co. Limerick - On 18th November, 1961, three masked men, one of whom carried a knife and another an iron bar, entered a sub Post Office by the back door. They demanded the keys of the safe and when told there was no safe one of them snatched a bag containing £100 and dashed out of the premises. Three young men aged, 20 years, 19 years and 16½ years were arrested and charged. The oldest member of the trio was sentenced to two years detention and the youngest member to one years detention. The third member, who alleged in Court that the Gardai conspired to "frame" him was sentenced to three years detention.

Co. Clare - On 4th May, 1962, at 2 a.m., the premises of a Post Office were broken into by two masked men one of whom carried a toy gun. They roused the occupants from their sleep, assaulted the postmistress and her husband by striking them with their hands and took £122 from a drawer which they broke open.

Two labourers, aged 23 and 21 years were arrested and charged. They were each sentenced to three years Penal Servitude.

<u>Co. Westmeath</u> - On 4th July, 1962, two men carrying what appeared to be revolvers entereda Post Office assaulted the Postmaster and Postmistress by striking them about the head with the weapons, and took away Postal Orders, Saving Certificates and Saving Gift Tokens to the value of £98. They left the scene in a motor car. On the following day two young men - non-nationals - were arrested and charged. They were sentenced to two years imprisonment with hard labour. The sentence was suspended on condition that they left this Country fortwith, which they did.

Co. Limerick - On 24th July, 1962, at 2 a.m., four men called at a Petrol Station on the pretence of requiring petrol. When the attendant approached to serve them he was seized from behind struck a number of blows and bundled into a Toilet which formed part of the Station. The men then broke open the office and took the sum of £74 from the cash till.

Four men aged 22, 21, 19 and 17 years were arrested and charged. Two of them were sentenced to two years imprisonment with hard labour and the other two were sentenced to two years detention.
