FOREWORD

Commissioner of the Garda Siochana to the Minister for Justice

I have the honour to submit my Report on the Garda Siochána for the year 1976.

Indictable offences which were recorded during the year numbered 54,382. This was an increase of 5,995, or 12.4%, over the figure for the previous crime accounting year, when 48,387 indictable offences were recorded. There were 19 murders, four less than in 1975. Detected crimes amounted to 22,482, or 41.3% of the total number recorded. The detection rate in 1975 was 43.4%.

I gladly and thankfully acknowledge, on behalf of the Garda, our indebtedness to the general public, whose sustained goodwill found expression throughout the year in an ever-intensifying co-operation which, particularly in the domain of information and intelligence, has proved of incalculable value to the Gardaí in dealing with crime and subversion.

I gratefully acknowledge, too, the support and co-operation received from the Press: the fair minded and responsible reportage of current events is, indeed, essential to the preservation of those free institutions which are the hallmark of a democratic state, and among which the Press itself occupies an honoured place.

A special tribute is due to Radio Teletís Éireann for its whole-hearted assistance and unfailing co-operation.

PART I - CRIME

Crime statistics have been computerised since the 1st January, 1976. Certain crime categories have been further broken down to provide more information concerning the type of property affected. Some crime categories have been re-grouped under one or other of the four main groups of indictable offences. The crime groups, with categories of offences in each group, are shown in the statistical return of indictable offences for 1976 on pages 8 – 17.

Sections 24 to 27 of the Larceny Act, 1916, were repealed by the Criminal Law (Jurisdiction) Act, 1976, which came into force on 1st June, 1976. Offences under these Sections, namely, Sacrilege, Burglary, Housebreaking and Breaking and Entering with Intent to Commit a Felony, committed since 1st June, 1976, are recorded as Burglary or Aggravated Burglary in accordance with the provisions of the Act of 1976. Offences of this nature committed prior to the 1st June, 1976, are recorded as they were designated under the repealed Sections of the Larceny Act, 1916. These changes account for any significant increase in offences of Burglary and any corresponding decrease in offences of Sacrilege, Housebreaking and Breaking and Entering with Intent, etc., in the figures for 1976.

Indictable Offences:

Indictable Offences which came to the notice of the Garda Siochana during the year ended 31st December, 1976, number 54,382 as compared with 48,387 in the year ended 31st December, 1975, an increase of 5,995 (12.4%).

In the Dublin Metropolitan Area, 29,872 indictable offences were recorded, an increase of 3,065 (11.4%) on the figures for 1975; and of the total crimes recorded in the State 54.9% occurred in the Dublin Metropolitan Area.

The Dublin Metropolitan Area has an estimated population of 829,660, or 28% of the total population of the State.

Detection of Crime:

The overall detection rate in 1976 was 41.3% (43.4% in 1975). The detection rate varies from 90.3% in offences against the person to 36.7% in the less serious forms of larceny.

The total number of indictable offences detected was 22,482. Proceedings were taken in 21,028 cases; 686 cases were dealt with under the Juvenile Liaison Officer Scheme; and 768 cases were dealt with by way of formal caution of Juveniles in areas where the Juvenile Liaison Officer Scheme is not in operation.

Offences Against The Person (Group I):

Murder, manslaughter, dangerous driving causing death, traffic fatalities, possession of firearms with intent to endanger life, assault and related offences fall into this group. In all, 1,714 such offences were recorded, an increase of 17.7% on 1975, with a detection rate of 90.3%. The detection rate in 1975 was 89.1%.

The overall figure of 1,714 "Offences Against The Person" includes 606 (35.4%) committed in the Dublin Metropolitan Area; and the detection rate in the Dublin Metropolitan Area was 81.5% (74.7% in 1975).

Murder

There were 19 murders in 1976, as compared with 23 murders in 1975. There were 6 offences of attempted murder.

Manslaughter:

There were 15 cases of manslaughter in 1976, 12 of which arose out of road accidents.

Traffic Fatalities:

There were 515 traffic fatalities in 1976, and 12 of these were recorded as manslaughter. In 1975 there were 592 road traffic fatalities, 5 of which were recorded as manslaughter.

Twenty-eight persons (46 in 1975) were charged with dangerous driving causing death, and 16 persons (19 in 1975) were charged with dangerous driving causing serious bodily injury.

Offences Against Property With Violence (Group II):

Offences of Burglary, Aggravated Burglary, Robbery, Arson, (offences of Sacrilege, Housebreaking, Breaking and Entering, etc., committed between 1st January and 1st June, 1976), and serious malicious damage to property are included in this group. In all, 20,903 such offences were recorded in 1976, an increase of 27.2 % on 1975, with a detection rate of 43.8% (48.4% in 1975).

Of the offences in this group 11,047 were committed in the Dublin Metropolitan Area, 52.8% of the total figure, with a detection rate of 47.3% (54% in 1975).

Robbery:

There were 909 robberies recorded in 1976, 206 more than in 1975, and 186 of these robberies were cases of armed robbery. There were 153 armed robberies in 1975. Criminal proceedings were taken in 365 cases, a detection rate of 40.2%. The detection rate in 1975 was 45.4%.

Arson and Malicious Damage:

There were 572 cases of malicious damage and 272 (47.6%) were detected. The total figure includes 147 offences of Arson. In 1975 out of a total figure of 567, 138 were offences of Arson.

Offences which involved breaking and entering premises, namely, Burglary, Aggravated Burglary, Sacrilege, Housebreaking, Entering with Intent and Possession of Housebreaking Tools, amounted to 19,372; and 8,055 (41.6%) such offences were detected. In 1975, there were 15,160 offences of this nature and 7,333 or 48.4% were detected.

Larcenies, Etc. (Group III):

Larcenies, Forgeries and Frauds of various kinds fall into this group. There were 31,540 such offences in 1976, an increase of 2,178 (7.4%) on 1975. 11,583 (36.7%) were detected. In 1975, the detection rate for this group was 36.8%.

The overall figure of 31,540 recorded offences in this group includes 18,107 offences (57.4%) committed in the Dublin Metropolitan Area with a detection rate of 5,120 (28.3%). In 1975, the detection rate was 27.5% in the Dublin Metropolitan Area.

The number of larcenies from unattended vehicles, 11,560, increased by 2,046 (21.5%) on the previous year.

Thefts of motor vehicles, 835, were up by 269 (47.5%) on the previous year.

Other Indictable Offences (Group IV):

This is a general crime group with a total of 225 offences. The number of these offences detected was 201 (89.3%). The overall figure decreased by 912 (80.2%) on 1975, when the detection rate was 85.7%. Of these offences 112 were committed in the Dublin Metropolitan Area and 95 (84.8%) were detected in the Dublin Metropolitan Area.

CRIME PREVENTION

While crime prevention is a fundamental duty of every member of the force, in each division specially trained personnel have been assigned to this aspect of police work. In Dublin, the Crime Prevention Unit is located at Osmond House, Ship Street.

During 1976, 99 lectures on crime prevention were given to groups representing various interests such as ladies' clubs, private security training organisations and residents' associations, at different centres in the Dublin area. In addition, lectures and talks on crime prevention were delivered by crime prevention personnel throughout the country. Leaflets advising on home security, pay office security, movements of cash, prevention of armed hold-ups, stock and shop security, and dangers to children, were distributed to the public.

Crime prevention exhibition stands were made available at the following centres:

- (1) R.D.S., Ballsbridge, Dublin, from 2nd to 6th March, 1976, on the occasion of the Irish Motor Show.
- (2) R.D.S., Ballsbridge, Dublin, from 4th to 8th May, 1976, on the occasion of the Spring Show.
- (3) R.D.S., Ballsbridge, Dublin, from 3rd to 8th August, 1976, on the occasion of the Horse Show.
- (4) Limerick City on 25th and 26th August, 1976, at the Limerick Annual Show.
- (5) Mosney, Co. Meath, from 4th to 6th September, 1976, at the National Community Games.
- (6) Cork City on 30th and 31st October, 1976, at the Ideal Homes Exhibition.
- (7) Dublin (Ireland House), 22nd to 26th November, 1976, Irish Industry Security Association.

The public took a keen interest in the Garda Stand on these occasions. Advice was given on various aspects of security, and crime prevention literature was distributed.

During the year, the Crime Prevention Unit staff carried out 207 crime prevention surveys of business premises and dwellinghouses, together with special security surveys of State and Semi-State buildings. Similar surveys were carried out by crime prevention personnel throughout the country.

Many people seeking crime prevention advice visited the new exhibition room at Osmond House, Ship Street, Dublin, and the exhibition room at the Bridewell Garda Station in Cork City.

The Crime Prevention Unit is also responsible for the "Garda Patrol" weekly television programme which continued to show results in prevention and detection of crime during the year.

GARDA JUVENILE LIAISON OFFICER SCHEME

The Garda Juvenile Liaison Officer Scheme was first established in 1963 in the Dublin Metropolitan Area, and later extended to the cities of Cork, Limerick and Waterford and more recently to large towns throughout the country — Clonmel, Drogheda, Dundalk, Kilkenny, Sligo, Tralee, Wexford and Galway. In 1976, the scheme was extended to Athlone, Cobh, Balbriggan, Carlow, Tullamore and New Ross. Juvenile Liaison Officers will be appointed shortly at Killarney, Longford and Gorey. Garda Juvenile Liaison Officers are specially selected members and receive training in dealing with juveniles involved in deviant and anti-social behaviour. At present, there are 4 Sergeants, 31 Gardaí and 2 Ban Ghardaí employed in the operation of the scheme.

The aims of the Scheme are to prevent children and young persons under the age of 17 years, who are at risk, from becoming involved in deviant or criminal behaviour; and in the cases of those who have already offended in a minor way, to divert them into legitimate activities and prevent them from becoming adult criminals.

Under the Scheme a minor under the age of 17 years implicated in crime (burglary, larceny and the like) may be dealt with by caution as an alternative to court proceedings and be subject to the surveillance and guidance of the Juvenile Liaison Officer until the age of 17 years is reached. Supervision may be withdrawn before reaching that age if it is considered that no risk is involved.

Since the inception of the Scheme in 1963, 10,385 offenders have been cautioned and supervised by the Garda.

During the year, 686 juveniles were admitted to the Scheme (593 boys and 93 girls).

Outside the areas where Juvenile Liaison Officers have been appointed there is also provision for the cautioning of juveniles under the age of 17 years for certain minor crimes and offences. These young people are subject to a less formal type of surveillance by the local Gardai for as long as may be warranted.

During the year, 768 juveniles within this category were cautioned (697 boys and 71 girls),

DRUGS UNIT

The Drugs Unit, which was formed in 1968, has over the years grown in manpower and volume of work. It is based in Dublin Castle and is available for preventive and detective duties in relation to dangerous drugs in any part of the country. In addition, a number of members in each division have completed attachment courses with the Drugs Unit at Dublin Castle. A dog specially trained to locate drugs is attached to the Drugs Unit and has proved especially helpful in this regard.

During 1976, there was a decrease in the number of persons charged with drug offences: 289 compared with 333 in 1975. Cannabis was the most widely used drug.

Members of the Drugs Unit are available to give advice to parents and teachers, while meetings are regularly held with doctors and associated professional groups on the subject of drug abuse. Members of the Drugs Unit cooperate with the Department of Health in compiling their drug education programme.

Drug supplies are procured by postal smuggling, by means of forged prescriptions, and as proceeds of housebreakings at pharmacies and doctors' surgeries of which there were 141 cases in 1976, 115 of them in the Dublin Metropolitan Area.

In 1976, members of the Drugs Unit continued to liaise with the Customs Service Co-Ordinating Committee on drug abuse, with the various drug advisory centres, and with external police forces in relation to suspected drug traffickers.

A member of the Drugs Unit attended the International Conference on Drug Abuse during 1976 in Paris.

An Information Centre which deals with all aspects of law enforcement relating to drugs has been set up at Headquarters.

SUB-AQUA UNIT

The Garda Sub-Aqua Unit was established on an official basis in 1966. The purpose of the Unit is to carry out underwater searches for:

- (a) Weapons used in the commission of crime, or other evidence of crime deposited in water;
- (b) bodies of victims of crime or drowning accidents.

The Unit carried out twenty-five major search operations during 1976, in rivers and canals, and in the open sea.

DOG HANDLING UNIT

A Dog Handling Unit was introduced in 1960 and has proved useful in pursuit of offenders, and in searching for stolen property, drugs or other evidence. The Unit which has six dogs at its base in Dublin, and one at Sligo, operates in all parts of the country. The dog and his handler are trained together, and work as a team. During 1976, dog teams were concerned in forty-four arrests in the course of numerous patrols and searches.

THE '999' EMERGENCY SERVICE

In 1976, a total of 133,034 emergency '999' calls was received by the Gardai: 118,967 at the Communications Centre, Dublin Castle, 7,794 at the Communications Room, Union Quay, Cork, 4,765 at the Communications Room, William Street, Limerick, 813 at the Communications Room, Waterford, and 695 at Galway Station.

WEIGHTS AND MEASURES

There are 49 sergeants exmployed as ex-officio inspectors of weights and measures throughout the country. They are primarily concerned with enforcement of Weights and Measures Acts and the Merchandise Marks Acts. Two of these sergeants are employed in Cork, two in Limerick, two in Bray, two in Howth and one on the verification of taximeters in the Dublin area.

ROAD TRAFFIC

The Special Traffic Corps which was set up in 1973 is operational in all Garda divisions throughout the country. The Traffic Corps Unit in each division is under the direct control of the Divisional Chief Superintendent, who exercises day-to-day control through a nominated inspector. The Special Traffic Corps complements the activities of the Force in general in the management and control of traffic and accident prevention.

In addition to their main duties of traffic control and accident prevention, the Special Traffic Corps afford assistance in various emergency situations, and indeed have made many detections and arrests for crimes and offences unrelated to traffic management. Much useful work is being done by those members who have received special instruction in accident investigation, including for example advanced techniques in vehicle examination, thereby increasing the efficiency with which road accidents and other incidents are investigated.

The Special Traffic Corps is entirely mobile and is fully equipped with all modern aids for accident prevention, traffic diversion and enforcement of legislation such as that covering road traffic and road haulage.

In an effort to enhance road safety and reduce traffic congestion, discussions regularly take place between Garda Officers throughout the country and conferences are held with Road Authorities and other interested bodies. Meetings have been held at many accident "black spots" with a view to improving conditions. Consultation with representatives of Local Authorities, Transport Companies, Road Safety Officers, School Committees and other organisations concerned with traffic problems is maintained on an on-going basis.

To create closer public awareness of road safety, lectures are frequently given to schoolchildren in schools and to parent committees and other Associations throughout the State.

During 1976, out of a total number of 2,949 such lectures by Officers of the Garda Siochána 2,832 were given to schoolchildren.

Schoolchildren are also instructed in road behaviour at a Special Traffic School in Clontarf, Dublin, which was set up in 1972 by Dublin Corporation.
