The Minister for Justice

Sir,

I have the honour to submit the following report on crime for the year ended 31st December, 1978.

I am able to say that the steep rise in the total crime figure which has characterised the past few years has, as far as some categories of crime are concerned, been reversed. In addition the number of crimes which were detected shows an increase on previous years.

The total crime figure of 62,000 is down by 946 or 1.5% on the 1977 figure. It is pleasant to report this decrease, the first since 1973, be it ever so small particularly since the major portion (875) of the decrease occurred in the Dublin Metropolitan Area where the crime rate has been highest. This is in part attributable to a greater awareness among the public of safeguarding their property and to the greater presence of Gardai on patrol duties.

The decrease in the crimes committed together with an increase in the detection rate of 2.1% is encouraging. It is hoped that the increases in the patrol force and the strengthening of the detective force during the past year will show an even greater improvement in the future but changes in the criminal justice system which would remove some of the criminal's present advantages would considerably enhance the prospects of preventing and detecting crime.

Offences against property with violence have fallen substantially by 8.8% on 1977, but regrettably offences against the person have increased. Crimes in this group totalled 2,266, an increase of 9.8% on the previous year. This increase is substantially down on the percentage increase in the previous two years (20.3% and 17.7% respectively). However, it is disturbing, as the increase is in the category of assault, wounding and other acts endangering life, including those committed against Gardai on duty. The yearly increase in the incidence of violent and serious attacks upon the persons of others is a continuing indication of the lowering of standards of behaviour and respect for others.

The number of motor vehicles has increased to 814,000 at present. As the numbers increase the hazards on the roads are likely to increase. Unfortunately, deaths from traffic accidents continue to rise. A drop in accidents was recorded during part of the year but towards the end of the year the accident rate rose again. Six hundred and twenty seven people were killed on the roads in 1978 and this was 51 more than recorded in 1977.

The total value of all property stolen was £10,372,354 of which property valued £1,098,695 (10.6%) was recovered. The proportion of stolen property recovered has been falling in recent years and the trend is unlikely to alter.

As in previous years, I am happy to record my appreciation of the support and co-operation received from the public generally as well as from the media. Ultimately the success attained by the Garda Siochana in its task of preventing crime is directly related to the degree to which the Force is supported and assisted by the citizens themselves.

INDICTABLE OFFENCES

Indictable offences which came to the notice of the Garda Siochana during the year ended 31st December, 1978, numbered 62,000 as compared to 62,946 in the year ended 31st December, 1977, a decrease of 1.5%.

In the Dublin Metropolitan Area (DMA) 35,024 indictable offences were recorded, a decrease of 875 (2.4%) on the figure for 1977. Of the total crimes recorded in the State 56.5% occurred in the DMA.

The DMA has an estimated population of 829,660 based on the 1971 census of population or 28% of the total population of the State.

DETECTION OF CRIME

The overall detection rate in 1978 was 40.7% (38.8% in 1977). The detection rate varies from 89.5% in respect of Offences Against the Person to 35.9% in the less serious forms of larceny.

The total number of indictable offences detected was 25,286. Proceedings were taken in 23,152 cases, 961 cases were dealt with under the Juvenile Liaison Scheme and the remainder were dealt with by way of the formal caution of juveniles in areas where the Juvenile Liaison Scheme is not in operation and are included in the figure of 2,134, col.17 of indictable offences table.

OFFENCES AGAINST THE PERSON (GROUP I)

Murder, Manslaughter, Dangerous Driving Causing Death, Traffic Fatalities, Possession of Firearms with Intent to endanger Life, Assault and related offences comprise this group. In 1978 a total of 2,266 offences were recorded in this group, an increase of 9.8% on 1977. The detection rate was 89.5% (87.3% in 1977).

The overall figure of 2,266 offences against the person includes 916 (40.4%) committed in the DMA where the detection rate was 84.1% (79% in 1977).

MURDER

There were 14 murders in 1978, as compared with 25 in 1977. There were 5 cases of attempted murder.

MANSLAUGHTER

There were 17 cases of manslaughter in 1978, 2 of which arose out of traffic accidents.

TRAFFIC FATALITIES

There were 627 deaths arising from 576 fatal traffic accidents and 2 of these were recorded as manslaughter. In 1977, there were 576 traffic fatalities, 8 of which were recorded as manslaughter.

29 persons (32 in 1977) were charged with dangerous driving causing death and 8 persons (12 in 1977) were charged with dangerous driving causing serious bodily injury.

OFFENCES AGAINST PROPERTY WITH VIOLENCE (GROUP II)

Offences of Burglary, Aggravated Burglary, Robbery, Arson and serious malicious damage to property are included in this Group. A total of 21,119 such offences were recorded in 1978, a decrease of 8.8% on 1977 and the detection rate was 44.1% (41% in 1977).

Of the total number of offences in this Group 11,416 (54.1%) were committed in the DMA and the detection rate was 47.1% (43.1% in 1977).

ROBBERY

There were 920 robberies in 1978, and 217 of these involved the use of arms. The figures show a decrease of 133 (12.6%) on those recorded in 1977. Proceedings were taken in 372 cases and the detection rate was 40.7% (32.3% in 1977).

ARSON AND MALICIOUS DAMAGE

There were 1,019 cases of malicious damage of which 114 were cases of arson; 540 (53%) were detected. In 1977 the total figure was 770 and of these 114 were cases of arson.

BURGLARY

Offences of breaking and entering premises, namely, burglary and aggravated burglary amounted to 19,136 of which 7,813 (40.8%) were detected. In 1977, a total of 21,268 offences of this nature were recorded and the detections were 8,186 (38.5%).

LARCENIES ETC. (GROUP III)

Larcenies, forgeries and frauds of various kinds comprise this group. In 1978, 38,397 such offences were recorded and this showed an increase of 932 (2.5%) on the figure for 1977. A total of 13,771 (35.9%) of these offences were detected. In 1977 detections amounted to 12,922 (34.5%).

The overall figure of 38,397 offences recorded in this Group includes 22,576 (58.8%) committed in the DMA where detections totalled 6,430 (28.5%). In 1977, detections in the DMA totalled 5,630 (25.4%). The number of larcenies from unattended vehicles at 14,193, shows a decrease of 307 (2.1%) on the figure for the previous year.

Thefts of motor vehicles, 694, show a decrease of 12 (1.7%) on the figure recorded in 1977.

OTHER INDICTABLE OFFENCES (GROUP IV)

This is a general crime group in which 218 offences were recorded. A total of 180 (82.6%) of these offences were detected.

When compared with 1977 the overall figure shows a decrease of 46 (17.4%). Of the total number of offences recorded 116 (53.2%) were committed in the DMA and 100 (86.2%) of these were detected.

CRIME PREVENTION

Specially trained personnel are engaged in crime prevention advisory work in all Garda Divisions. In Dublin the Crime Prevention Unit is located at Osmond House, Ship Street.

During the year, 72 lectures on crime prevention and home security were given to residents associations, ladies clubs, security organisations and business groups at different venues in the Dublin area. Lectures were also delivered by crime prevention personnel in country areas as occasions demanded. Pamphlets were distributed at lectures and exhibitions and a special one was devised for supply to tourists.

Crime prevention exhibitions were mounted at the following venues:

- (1) R.D.S. Dublin, on the occasions of the Irish Motor Show, the Spring Show and the Horse Show.
- (2) Cork City at the Ideal Homes Exhibition.
- (3) Galway City at an Industrial Exhibition.
- (4) Sligo at the Annual Show.
- (5) Limerick at the Industrial Show.
- (6) Tralee at the Annual Show.
- (7) Clonmel at the Annual Show.
- (8) Ardara, Co. Donegal, at the Industrial Show.

Great public interest was evident at these exhibitions and security advice was provided as required.

There were 310 crime prevention surveys carried out on dwellinghouses, commercial and business premises as well as special surveys at State and Semi-State buildings.

The exhibition rooms at Osmond House and the Bridewell Garda Station, Cork, were visited by large crowds who displayed a keen interest in modern crime prevention equipment.

The Crime Prevention Unit is responsible for the presentation of the 'Garda Patrol' programme. Public interest continued to increase and greater emphasis was placed in pointing out and reminding viewers of crime prevention techniques.

GARDA JUVENILE LIAISON OFFICER SCHEME

The Scheme was first established in 1963 in the DMA and later extended to the cities of Cork, Limerick and Waterford, and more recently to large towns throughout the country — Clonmel, Drogheda, Dundalk, Kilkenny, Sligo, Tralee, Wexford, Galway, Athlone, Cobh, Balbriggan, Carlow, Tullamore, New Ross, Killarney, Longford and Gorey. Garda Juvenile Liaison Officers are specially selected members, and receive training in dealing with juveniles involved in deviant and anti-social behaviour. At present there are 4 Sergeants, 35 Gardai and 2 Ban Ghardai employed in the operation of the Scheme, an additional Juvenile Liaison Officer being appointed at Limerick City during 1978.

The aims of the Scheme are to prevent children and young persons under the age of 17 years, who are at risk, from becoming involved in deviant and criminal behaviour; and in the cases of those who have already offended in a minor way, to divert them into legitimate activities, and prevent them from becoming adult criminals.

Under the scheme, a minor under the age of 17 years, implicated in crime (burglary, larceny and the like) may be dealt with by caution as an alternative to court proceedings, and be subject to the surveillance and guidance of the Juvenile Liaison Officer until the age of 17 years is reached. Supervision may be withdrawn before reaching this age if it is considered that no risk is involved.

Since the inception of the Scheme in 1963, 12,374 offenders have been cautioned and supervised by the Gardai.

During the year 961 juveniles were admitted to the Scheme (836 Boys and 125 girls).

Outside the areas where Juvenile Liaison Officers have been appointed there is also provision for the cautioning of Juveniles under the age of 17 years for certain minor crimes and offences. These young people are subject to a less formal type of surveillance by the local Gardai for as long as may be necessary, and are included in the figure of 2,134 at column 17 of Indictable Offences Table.

GARDA COMMUNITY RELATIONS

During the year 1978, a new office, the Garda Community Relations Office, was established in the Force.

It has responsibity for Community Relations, the Juvenile Liaison Officer Scheme and the Garda Sub-Aqua Unit.

The new section has its offices at Garda Headquarters and is staffed by a superintendent and two inspectors.

DRUGS UNIT.

The Drugs Unit is based in Dublin Castle, and operates throughout the country. A number of members in each Garda division have undergone drugs courses with the Drugs Unit at Dublin Castle.

During 1978 there was an increase in the number of persons charged with drug offences: 501 compared with 381 in 1977. Cannabis continues to be the most widely abused substance.

Home grown cannabis is appearing much more frequently than heretofore. The postal services continue to be used in smuggling cannabis resin from India, Amsterdam and England.

90% of the illicit supply of hard drugs is obtained by larceny from chemists shops and manufacturing premises.

The unit, under the auspices of the Health Education Bureau, gave 84 lectures to voluntary organisations, to professional groups, and to prison and security services. An on-going advice service is available to the Drugs Unit, Dublin Castle.

A member of the Drugs Unit attended an international conference on drugs in Paris.

SUB-AQUA UNIT

The Garda Sub-Aqua Unit was established in 1966 to carry out underwater searches for:

- (a) Weapons the subject of crime or other evidence of criminal activity.
- (b) Bodies of crime victims or drowning accidents.

During the year, the Unit carried out twenty eight major search operations in rivers, harbours, canals and sea.

DOG HANDLING UNIT

This Unit, which has been operational since 1960, again proved to be very helpful in searches and in patrolling areas of lawlessness. During the year the Unit participated in the arrest of 289 persons.

THE EMERGENCY '999' SERVICE

During the year, 149,596 emergency '999' calls were received by the Gardai: 135,050 at the Communications Centre, Dublin Castle; 8,624 at the Communications Room, Union Quay, Cork; 3,282 at the Communications Room, Henry Street, Limerick; 1,500 at Galway station and 1,140 at the Communications Room, Waterford.

WEIGHTS AND MEASURES

There are 49 Sergeants employed as ex-officio Inspectors of Weights and Measures at 44 locations throughout the country. Their function is to enforce the Weights and Measures Acts and allied legislation.

STOLEN MOTOR VEHICLE INVESTIGATION UNIT

This Unit which operates countrywide is based at Dublin Castle.

Close liaison is maintained with similar units in other countries and this co-operation has led to the recovery of many stolen vehicles.

During the year under review the Unit recovered 245 stolen vehicles, 194 of which were stolen in the State and the remainder in England and Northern Ireland. In addition 47 illegally imported vehicles were located.

ROAD TRAFFIC

The upward spiral of traffic accidents in late 1977 continued until mid 1978. Consequent on the re-introduction of the blood/urine tests and an increase in the strength of the special Traffic Corps an appreciable drop in accidents was recorded. However, towards the end of the year an upward trend was again in evidence and particularly so in relation to fatal accidents. A total of 627 persons were killed in road traffic accidents in 1978, as compared with 576 in 1977.

In the year under review road safety lectures were delivered to school children and to other interested parties with a view to developing a greater sense of road safety.

PUBLIC RELATIONS AND PRESS OFFICE

The demand for the various services provided by the Public Relations Office continues to increase. Invitations to lectures, talks and exhibitions are now averaging over two per week. Through this service, a valuable dialogue is maintained between the Force and a vital cross-section of the population, ranging from the schoolgoer to members of social and professional bodies. An extension of the service to schools is the now familiar concerts jointly arranged by this office and the Garda Band.

During the year a total of 17 centres were visited in the Dublin area. For the thousands of children encountered in the 17 schools visited throughout the year, there was added a new dimension to their knowledge of and attitude towards the Force.

A well informed public is essential for the mutual understanding which forms the basis of good public relations. The office seeks, through the co-operation of the press, to keep the public informed in a fair and balanced manner about the Force's activities. Crime, because it is the abnormal or the unusual, continues to make "news". The Garda response to crime is equally interesting though less spectacular in news terms even where details can be disclosed.

There are many obstacles in the way of making such details available and these relate mainly to considerations of security, personal privacy, operational constraints and judicial rules.

Despite these restrictions — or perhaps because of them — the office gives a vital service in providing the necessary briefing and background information required for a better public understanding of the Garda role.

One noticeable trend throughout the year, was the extent to which the general public are now having recourse to the office as an information service. This is evidenced by the many enquiries on law enforcement, as well as routine legal and procedural matters of Garda administration. This has in no way diminished the steady flow of visitors, journalists and researchers who seek the services of the office on matters such as legislation, policing, crime, and the many social aspects of the aforementioned.
