The Minister for Justice

Sir.

The following is the annual report on crime which came to the notice of the Garda Siochána during the year ended 31st December 1985.

The crime situation continues to be a serious problem making a high level of demand upon Garda resources. It is, however, pleasing to report that there was an overall decrease of 8.5% in recorded crime in comparison to 1984. This is the second consecutive year in which recorded crime showed a decrease; the last period of such occurrence being 1960-1961. The total number of indictable offences recorded for the year was 91,285 as against 99,727 for 1984.

The number of offences recorded in each of the main offence groups for 1985 with particulars of the variations over the 1984 figures shown in parenthesis were as follows:

GROUP I	Offences Against the Person: Murder, Manslaughter, Wounding, Assault, etc.:	2,348	(+0.7%).
GROUP 2	Offences Against Property With Violence: Burglary, Robbery, Arson, Malicious Damage, etc.:	37,185	(-9.3%).
GROUP 3	Larcenies, Forgeries, Frauds, etc.:	51,354	(-9.3%).
GROUP 4	Other Indictable Offences not included in Groups 1 to 3:	398	(-11.2%).

A total of 25 murders was recorded for the year, 18 of which were detected. There were 23 murders recorded in 1984 with 22 being detected.

Sadly, we have to record once again the murder of a member of the Force in the execution of his duty. Sergeant Patrick Morrissey died gallantly when pursuing gunmen fleeing the scene of a robbery. Two men were charged with his murder.

Simple burglaries decreased by 12.2%. However, crimes of aggravated burglary (i.e. where firearms or other offensive weapons were carried) increased by 15.1% from 1,129 to 1,299. Of these 216 referred to dwelling houses.

There was a disturbing increase in armed crimes from 440 to 616—an increase of 40%. This increasing incidence of armed robberies is a trend in the crime situation that has developed in recent years. Increased attention is being paid to this problem and measures have been introduced which it is hoped will bring about a much-needed improvement in this regard.

Larcenies in general showed a decrease of 8.2%, while larcenies from unattended vehicles again showed a marked decrease of 16.2%. This particular crime category accounted for 16.5% of overall crime.

The number of crimes recorded in the Dublin Metropolitan Area was 52,588, a decrease of 8.8%. The total for this area represented 57.6% of the overall crime recorded in the State.

The number of indictable offences detected was 29,795 (32.6%). The detection rate for 1984 was 32.2%. Although there was a marginal improvement for the year, I am disappointed with the results as I regard crime detection as an integral part of crime prevention.

Of the total number of persons convicted for recorded crimes in 1985 or dealt with by way of caution: 3,969 were juveniles under 17 years (34.4%). The figure for 1984 was 3,924 or 29.1%.

The total value of property stolen during the year was £31,165,310 and recovered property totalled £2,664,983 (8.5%). The figures for 1984 were £34,474, 252 and £2,572,524 (7.5%), respectively.

During the year 1,270 persons were charged with drugs offences arising from 1,637 seizures. The figures for previous year were 1,369 and 1,704 respectively. Training has continued to be given by way of Special Drugs Courses to our members and a total of 2,368 now represents the number trained throughout the Force. In addition, during the year an intensive course was organised for selected members by the U.S. Drugs Enforcement Agency and our sincere thanks are due to the United States Authorities for this very valuable gesture. Talks and discussions to, and with, Community Groups and Organisations have proved to be of value in the prevention of drugs misuse and also in furthering understanding of this subject between Gardaí and the public. During the year 958 such talks were given. In the area of drugs enforcement we would like to place on record the valuable assistance we have been receiving from the Irish Customs Service.

Although the figures for fatal traffic accidents are still unacceptably high it is encouraging to record a decrease for the second successive year. There were 377 fatal traffic accidents in 1985 resulting in the deaths of 410 people. This was a decrease of 57 accidents and 55 fewer persons killed. The figures in 1984 were 52 and 70 respectively less than in the previous year.

Emphasis continued to be placed on maintaining as many members as possible on patrol duties to ensure maximum contact between members of the public and the Gardaí. It is, I believe, significant that the overall level of recorded crime coincided with this development.

The prevention of crime must be an important component of our future strategy for policing. However, the scale of the problem and the random and opportunist nature of much of the crime reported to the Gardaí, decrees that this cannot be a strategy for the Gardaí alone, but rather the most apparent feature of the contract between the Gardaí and the public.

The Neighbourhood Watch Scheme was formally launched in 1985. At the end of the year 29,600 households, mostly in the Dublin Area, were members various such Schemes. Similarly, the Community Alert Schemes continued to increase and over 175 Schemes had been established by the end of 1985. It is hoped that the impetus given by the initial publicity to these Schemes will be maintained.

A significant development during the year was the completion of the installation of the Garda National Radio Network which was formally switched-on at Galway on the 20th February, 1986, by the Minister for Justice. It provides a sophisticated radio communications system to all Garda Divisions throughout the State. It also involves the provision of personal and car radio sets for all Gardaí engaged in outdoor duties, so that at no time need a Garda be isolated in any part of the country.

A novel feature of the system is that members of the public in rural areas can contact the Gardai free of charge by the use of a special device installed outside all unattended Garda Stations. This facility is unique in Europe. The total investment to-date in the system is in the region of £11 million.

For the Gardaí the new system will mean much greater efficiency in the transmission and exchange of information and in the utilisation of manpower and patrol cars. For the public it should mean a more efficient Garda Service - for example in terms of a quicker response by the Gardaí to calls for assistance.

I place on record my appreciation of the co-operation received from Community Groups during the year, and, indeed, all those members of the public who actively helped or expressed their support.



INDICTABLE OFFENCES

Indictable offences which came to the notice of the Garda Siochána during the year ended 31st. December, 1985 numbered 91,285 as compared with 99,727 in the year ended 31st. December, 1984, a decrease of 8.5%.

In the Dublin Metropolitan Area (D.M.A.), 52,588 indictable offences were recorded, a decrease of (8.8%) on the figure for 1984. Of the total crimes recorded in the State 57.6% occurred in the D.M.A.

The D.M.A. has an estimated population of 1,017,897 based on the 1981 census of population, or 29.6% of the total population of the State.

CRIME RATE

Based on the 1981 Census of Population, the crime rate per 1,000 of the population was 26.5 with a rate of 51.7 in the D.M.A. and a rate of 16.0 outside the D.M.A. The following table shows the rate for each Division and the Dublin Metropolitan Area which is composed of 5 Divisions.



DETECTION OF CRIME

The overall detection rate in 1985 was 32.6% (32.2% in 1984). The detection rate varies from 80.2% in respect of Offences Against the Person to 27.4% in Offences Against Property with Violence.

The total number of indictable offences detected was 29,795. Proceedings were taken in 26,970 cases, and the remaining 2,825 cases (col. 17 of Indictable Offences table) include cases dealt with under the Juvenile Liaison Scheme.

OFFENCES AGAINST THE PERSON (GROUP I)

Murder; Manslaughter; Dangerous Driving causing Death; Traffic Fatalities; Possession of firearms with intent to endanger life; Assault and related offences comprise this group.

In 1985 a total of 2,348 offences were recorded in this group, an increase of 0.7% on 1984. The detection rate was 80.2% (82.0% in 1984).

The overall figure of 2,348 Offences Against the Person includes 781 (33.3%) committed in the D.M.A. where the detection rate was 60.8% (65.5% in 1984).

MURDER

There were 25 murders in 1985, seven (7) of which remain unsolved. There were 4 cases of attempted murder.

MANSLAUGHTER

There were 12 cases of manslaughter in 1985, four (4) of which arose out of traffic accidents.

TRAFFIC FATALITIES

There were 410 deaths arising from 377 fatal traffic accidents, a decrease of 55 deaths on the 1984 figure of 465. Four persons (14 in 1984) were charged with dangerous driving causing death and 4 persons (4 in 1984) were charged with dangerous driving causing serious bodily injury.

OFFENCES AGAINST PROPERTY WITH VIOLENCE (GROUP II)

Offences of burglary, aggravated burglary, robbery, arson and serious malicious damage to property are included in this group. A total of 37,185 offences were recorded in 1985, a decrease of 9.3% on 1984 and the detection rate was 27.4% (29.3% in 1984).

Of the total number of offences in this Group 20,382 (54.8%) were committed in the D.M.A. where the detection rate was 25.4% (27.6% in 1984).

ROBBERY AND AGGRAVATED BURGLARY

There were 1,847 robberies in 1985, a decrease of 31 on the previous year. Aggravated burglaries at 1,299 increased by 170 from 1129 in 1984. Firearm: were used in 86 cases of robbery and 530 cases of aggravated burglary, an increase of 7 and 169 respectively, on the figures for 1984. These figures show an overall increase of 176 armed crimes compared to the previous year.

ARSON AND MALICIOUS DAMAGE

There were 2,988 cases of malicious damage of which 180 cases were arson; 1,514 (50.7%) were detected. In 1984 the total figure for arson was 189, showing a decrease for 1985 of 4.8%.

BURGLARY

Offences of burglary numbered 30,917 of which 7,801 (25.2%) were detected. In 1984, a total of 35,228 offences of this nature were recorded showing a decrease of 12.2% for 1985.

LARCENIES ETC. (GROUP III)

Larcenies, forgeries and frauds of various kinds comprise this group. In 1985, 51,354 such offences were recorded and this shows a decrease of 4,591 (8.2%) on the figure for 1984. A total of 17,427 (33.9%) of these offences were detected. In 1984 detections amounted to 32.1%.

The overall figure of 51,354 offences recorded in this Group, includes 31,233 (60.8%) committed in the D.M.A. where detections totalled 7,948 (25.4%). In 1984 detections in the D.M.A. totalled 8,357 (24%). The number of larcenies from unattended vehicles at 15,049 shows a decrease of 2,904 (16.2%) on the figure for the previous year.

OTHER INDICTABLE OFFENCES (GROUP IV)

This is a miscellaneous crime group in which 398 offences were recorded. A total of 304 (76.4%) of these offences were detected.

When compared with 1984, the overall figure shows an decrease of 50 (11.2%). Of the total number of offences recorded, 192 (48.2%) were committed in the D.M.A. and 144 (75.0%) of these were detected.

The following are details of Undetected Murders

- In 1984 the remains of a man were found in a bog in Co. Louth. Post Mortem examination revealed that he had died from a bullet wound. He had been missing since 1981.
- (2) On the 21st December, 1984, the body of a woman was located at Loughmeraas, Dummore, Kilkenny. Post Mortem examination showed the cause of death as strangulation, probably manually. Deceased was missing from home since 21/10/84.
- (3) On 14th January, 1985, the body of a woman, in a state of decay, was found in her home near Limerick City. The cause of death was strangulation.
- (4) On 23rd March, 1985, the body of a man was found in a sleeping bag at Killnagloy, Ballincollig, Co. Cork. Post Mortem examination showed death was caused by a bullet wound in the head.
- (5) On the 20th August, 1985, the body of a man was found in a bedroom at his residence at Donnybrook, Co. Dublin. He died from gunshot wounds.
- (6) On the 9th September, 1985, the body of a man was found at Kinneyswill Road, Killeen, Newry, Co. Down. His arms and hands were bound and he had been shot twice with a shotgun. Investigations revealed that he was shot in Co. Louth.
- (7) On the 28th November, 1985, the body of a woman was found in an upstairs bedroom of her home at Sandycove, Co. Dublin. She had severe head injuries.

ARMS, AMMUNITION, EXPLOSIVES SEIZED BY THE GARDAÍ DURING THE YEAR 1985

During the year 1985, the following quantities of arms, ammunition, explosives, etc., illegally held, were seized by the Gardaí from various sources.

In addition to the above, quantities of cordtex, detonating fuse wire and bell wire were seized, together with component parts of firearms, assorted bomb-making material and explosive items, as well as timing devices and walkie-talkie sets.

SCENES OF CRIME EXAMINATION

During the year, the Scenes of Crime Examiners from the Fingerprint Section of the Technical Bureau attended the scenes of 22,149 crimes, compared with 26,199 during the previous year. Fingermarks from the scenes of 5,962 crimes were received at Fingerprint Section from Scenes of Crime Examiners throughout the country. In 1,664 instances, the fingermarks of culprits were identified compared with 1,646 identifications in 1984. 1,037 scenes of crime were visited by members attached to Ballistics Section compared with 1,174 scenes visited during the previous year.

FORENSIC SCIENCE

In 1985 the Forensic Science Laboratory received 3,458 full cases. Of these 1,588 were drug cases and 1,870 other cases covering hit-and-run accidents, murder, rape, fires, armed robberies, explosives, etc. There was a total of 24,071 separate items brought for analysis. There were 118 cases involving the use of firearms and 45 cases involving explosive substances.




During the year 1,162 persons were reported missing. At the end of the year 44 persons were still not traced.


DOG HANDLERS

Overall there are 15 dogs on allocation - 9 German Shepards and 6 Labradors. 7 of the German Shepards are used for general patrol and tracking while the remaining 2 are used in explosive searches. 5 of the Labradors are trained for drug searching while the remaining dog is used for explosive searching. Dogs were used in 110 searches for explosives and 73 searches for drugs. During the year a total of 295 arrests were made by dog handlers with dogs.

NEIGHBOURHOOD WATCH AND COMMUNITY ALERT

The implementation of both these programmes was successfully furthered during the year. Neighbour-hood Watch is a community based crime prevention programme by which a local community acts as "the eyes and ears" of local Gardaí. Members of a scheme come together to encourage each other in the implementation of crime prevention measures in respect of their own homes and agree to keep an eye on the homes of their neighbours. They are also encouraged to report promptly any strange or suspicious happenings in their neighbourhoods. Community Alert is a similar type of programme for rural areas but is directed primarily at the care and protection of the elderly, especially those residing in remote areas. Community Alert was originated by Muintir na Tire, who have thus shown commendable initiative in the encouragement of crime prevention measures.

At the end of 1985, 29,600 households, mostly in the Dublin area, were members of Neighbourhood Watch schemes, and over 175 Community Alert schemes had been established throughout the country.

JUVENILE LIAISON SCHEME

The Juvenile Liaison Scheme (by which first-time offenders under 17 years, are, in accordance with certain conditions, cautioned instead of being prosecuted), continue to assist young people who otherwise might well start a criminal career. The Juvenile Liaison Officers' brief is wider than the immediate supervision of first-time offenders and they continue their general involvement in community affairs, especially where juveniles are concerned.

SUB-AQUA UNIT

The Garda Sub-Aqua Unit was established in 1966 to carry out searches for:

- Bodies of victims of crime or drowning accidents.
- (b) Weapons used in the commission of crime or other evidence of crime deposited in water.

The Unit carried out 21 search operations during the year in connection with the investigation of crime. Resulting from 42 underwater search operations, the Unit recovered 29 bodies.

THE EMERGENCY 999 SERVICE

During the year 182,057 emergency 999 calls were received by the Garda: 144,841 calls at the Communications Centre, Dublin Castle; 24,780 at the Communications Room, Union Quay, Cork City; 4,057 calls at the Communications Room, Henry Street, Limerick; 3,648 calls at Eglinton Street Station, Galway City; 1,988 calls at the Communications Room, Waterford; 1,542 calls at the Communications Room, Dundalk; 931 calls at the Communications Room, Letterkenny, and 270 calls at the Communications Room, Portlaoise.

STOLEN MOTOR VEHICLE INVESTIGATION UNIT

This Unit which operates for the whole country is based in Dublin. Close liaison is maintained with similar units in other countries and this co-operation has led to the recovery of many stolen vehicles. During the year 1,546 vehicles were recorded as stolen. 1,244 of the vehicles stolen were motor cars while the remaining 470 vehicles consisted of motor cycles, scooters, lorries, van, etc.

ROAD TRAFFIC

There were 377 fatal traffic accidents during the year resulting in the deaths of 410 persons. These figures show a decrease of 55 in the numbers killed and 57 in the number of accidents compared to the figures for the previous year.

GARDA COMMUNITY RELATIONS

The Garda Community Relations Section administers community relations programmes throughout the country. The principal ones are the Crime Prevention Advisory Service; Juvenile Liaison Scheme; Neighbourhood Watch; Community Alert and Garda Patrol (the television crime information programme). Each Garda division has its own community relations and juvenile liaison officers who organise and administer programmes.

CRIME PREVENTION

Each division provides a Crime Prevention Advisory Service. Business-men, shop-keepers and others can have a security survey carried out free of charge on their premises, which will advise them on appropriate measures which can be taken in order to make their property less vulnerable to criminal attack. Other activities of the service include the mounting of crime prevention exhibitions; distribution of literature; provision of advice and guidance through the media as well as through lectures and talks to community groups. The weekly television programme "Garda Patrol", which celebrated 21 years of continuous running during 1985, has played an important role here in seeking and obtaining valuable information which has helped in the detection of crime. During the year 5,939 security surveys were undertaken and lectures were provided in 689 cases.

PUBLIC RELATIONS AND PRESS OFFICE

The year 1985 saw a significant expansion of the Office. Additional staff was provided, thus enabling the office to open seven days a week, from 7.30 a.m. to 11 p.m., each day. During these hours numerous queries from radio, television and newspaper interests, both in Ireland and abroad, were attended to.

Every effort was made to provide members of staff at locations of particular interest, e.g. the Air India disaster, the funeral of the late Sgt. Patrick Morrissey and presentation of Scott Medal ceremonies.

During the year under review numerous career lectures, exhibitions and functions were attended by staff of the office and articles designed to project the image of the Force were contributed to newspapers and magazines.

Meetings to promote greater understanding between the Office and media management were also held during the year.

MISUSE OF DRUGS

During 1985 a total of 1,270 persons were charged with offences unde the Misuse of Drugs Act 1977/1984. This compares with 1,369 persons charged in 1984, a reduction of 7.23%.

The total number of seizures of controlled drugs in 1985 was 1,637, a reduction of 3.93% on the figure of 1,704 for 1984.

In 1985, there was a significant increase in the amounts of heroin and cannabis seized. All heroin seizures were made in the Dublin Metropolitan Area. One accounted for 280 grammes. The large increase in the amount of cannabis seized during the year resulted from the finding of 62.00 kg. concealed in a cargo of fruit on arrival at Dublin docks.

The drug courses which commenced in 1981 were continued throughout 1985 and at the end of the year a total of 2,368 of all ranks had undergone training.

In 1985 a total of 958 lectures and talks on drug abuse were given by Drug Squad staff and selected Gardaí in each division to interested groups and organisations.

The Customs Service has played an active role in close co-operation with the Garda Síochána in dealing with seizures at points of entry to this country.
