Dear

I refer to your request, dated and received on 27th February, 2023 which you have made under the Freedom of Information Act 2014 (FOI Act) for records held by An Garda Síochána.

Part 1(n) of Schedule 1 of the FOI Act states that An Garda Síochána is listed as a partially included agency "insofar as it relates to administrative records relating to human resources, or finance or procurement matters". Therefore, only administrative records that relate to human resources, finance or procurement shall be considered.

Your request sought:

Under the FOI Act 2014, I am seeking the following:

- a list of all allowances payable to members of An Garda Siochána.
- the amount paid under each allowance heading for 2022, to include the total amount and the number of officers that were paid the allowance, either in full or partially.

I would prefer to receive this information electronically, ideally in its original electronic format.

I wish to inform you that I have decided to part granted your request on 28th March, 2023.

The purpose of this letter is to explain my decision.

1. Findings, particulars and reasons for decision

Details of your request were provided to the relevant sections within An Garda Síochána who have briefed this Office in respect of same. The tables below details the records sought in your request with a breakdown of allowance type, total amount and number of recipients paid.

Pursuant to Section 37 of the FOI Act I am refusing to release the number of receipts in receipt of the allowances in the table below as I believe that due to the small number of individuals involved, releasing this information could lead to the Garda members involved being easily identifiable beyond their family and friends and it would be considered a breach of the confidentiality upon which the information is being held by the Garda Organisation.

Section 2 - Interpretation of the Act

Under the FOI Act, records are released without any restriction as to how they may be used and thus release under the FOI Act, is in effect regarded as being released to the world at large. As a result, I am conscious of my obligations to retain personal information in a confidential and

secure manner and prevent personal information from being released into the public domain unnecessarily. Section 2 of the FOI Act defines personal information as follows:

2.(1) In this Act—

"personal information" means information about an identifiable individual that, either—

- (a) would, in the ordinary course of events, be known only to the individual or members of the family, or friends, of the individual, or
- (b) is held by an FOI body on the understanding that it would be treated by that body as confidential,

and, without prejudice to the generality of the foregoing, includes -

- (ii) information relating to the financial affairs of the individual,
- (iii) information relating to the employment or employment history of the individual

Section 37 - Personal Information

Section 37(1) provides that a public body shall refuse to grant a request if access to the record concerned would involve the disclosure of personal information. The release of the member's ranks could allow for a person(s) to become more identifiable and possibly named in the public domain and is personal information. I am therefore applying section 37(1) Personal Information which states:

37(1) Subject to this section, a head shall refuse to grant an FOI request if, in the opinion of the head, access to the record concerned would involve the disclosure of personal information (including personal information relating to a deceased individual)

As per Section 37 of the FOI Act, I have considered the public interest issues which arise in this case and have taken account of the following factors in favour of release:

Public Interest Test

As per section 37 of the FOI Act, I have considered the public interest issues which arise in this case and have taken account of the following factors in favour of release:

- Ensuring openness and transparency of Organisational functions to the greatest possible extent,
- The public interest in members of the public exercising their rights under the FOI Act,
- That three is more than just a transitory interest by the public in this information,
- The right to privacy is outweighed by the needs of the public.

In considering the public interest factors which favour withholding the records I have taken account of the following:

- Allowing a public body to hold personal information without undue access by members of the public,
- The public interest is not best served by releasing these records,
- That the Organisation can conduct its business in a confidential manner,

- That there is a reasonable and implied expectation by employees that sensitive personal information will remain confidential,
- That there is no overriding public interest that outweighs the individual's right to privacy.

A public interest was carried out when considering the release of the personal information. Having balanced the factors both for and against the release, I decided that the public interest in preserving the personal information and the reasonable expectation that information can be maintained in a confidential manner by An Garda Síochána in the context of its disciplinary proceedings outweighs the public interest which would be served were the records released to you.

2. Right of Appeal

The review will involve a complete reconsideration of the matter by a more senior member of An Garda Síochána and the decision will be communicated to you within 3 weeks. The making of a late appeal may be permitted in appropriate circumstances.
