Sir,

I have the honour to submit my Report on Crime for the year ended 30th September, 1965.

Hereafter in this report the year ended 30th September, 1965, is referred to simply as '1965'. References to years 1958 to 1962 are also to be taken as referring to years ended 30th September. References to years prior to 1958 relate to calendar years.

#### PART 1.

#### INDICTABLE OFFENCES.

#### Total number of Offences.

- (1) The number of indictable offences which were reported or became known to the Garda in 1965 was 16,736. The number in 1964 was 17,700 and the number in 1963 was 16,203. The 1965 total shows a decrease of 964 on the 1964 total and an increase of 533 on the 1963 total.
- (2) Details of the crimes and information on the result of proceedings are given in Appendix "A".

#### Detections.

- (3) Proceedings were instituted in respect of 10,568 offences in 1965. In 1,183 other cases the offenders were detected but for various reasons proceedings were not instituted. In most of those cases the offences were taken into consideration by the courts in dealing with other charges. The total number of offences detected was therefore 11,751 or 70% of offences recorded. In 1964 the percentage was 64% and in 1963 was 65%.
- (4) The incidence of indictable offences and detections in the years 1955 to 1965 inclusive, are shown as a graph in Appendix "B".

#### Incidence of Crime in Garda Divisions.

- (5) The number of indictable offences recorded and detected in each of the 19 Garda Divisions into which the State is now divided are shown in Appendix "C". Similar information in respect of the Garda Districts in which the cities of Ccrk, Limerick, Waterford and Galway are included, is also given there.
- (6) The following table shows the number of offences recorded in the Dublin Metropolitan Area and the rest of the State in 1964 and 1965.

(7) The decrease in crime is mainly due to a decrease of 1,019 indictable offences in the Dublin Metropolitan Area. The increase in crime in Divisions outside the Metropolitan Area is spread over 8 of the 18 Divisions, the highest being Carlow/Kildare, increase of 144 crimes or 27%, Wexford increase of 82 crimes or almost 17%, Cavan/Monaghan, increase of 66 crimes or 25%, Cork W.R. increase of 59 crimes or 30%, Kerry, increase of 43 crimes or 13%, Waterford/Kilkenny, increase of 40 crimes or 6. Decreases were recorded in the remaining Divisions resulting in an overall increase of 55 in Country Divisions.

#### Analysis of Offences in Four Groups.

(8) The number of indictable offences recorded and the number and percentage of detections in the four offence groups are shown in the following table with comparative figures for 1964:

#### Group 1 - Offences Against the Person.

- (9) This group includes murder, Manslaughter, Dangerous Driving Causing Death and Serious Bodily Harm, Wounding, Assault, Intimidation, Cruelty to and Abandoning Children and Sexual Offences.
- (10) The following table gives comparative figures of offences and detections in the years 1960 to 1965, inclusive:

#### Murder of Persons aged above One Year.

(11) Seven murders of persons aged above one year were recorded in 1965. Proceedings were instituted in six cases. In the other case the offender committed Suicide. Brief particulars of the seven cases are given in Appendix "D". Six crimes were recorded in 1964.

#### Murder of Infants aged One Year and Under.

(12) No crime of murder of infant was recorded in 1965 or in 1964.

#### Infanticide.

(13) No crime of infanticide was recorded in 1965. Three crimes of infanticide were recorded in 1964.

#### Attempt to Murder.

(14) One crime of attempting to murder was recorded in 1965 and proceedings were instituted. Brief particulars are included in Appendix "D". One crime was recorded in 1964.

#### Threats to Murder.

(15) No crime of threatening to murder was recorded in 1965. Two crimes of this nature were recorded in 1964.

#### Manslaughter (other than Traffic Fatalities).

(16) Five crimes were recorded in 1965. Proceedings were instituted in all cases. Five crimes of this nature were recorded in 1964. Brief particulars are given in Appendix "D".

#### Manslaughter (Traffic Fatalities).

(17) Two crimes were recorded in 1965 as compared with three crimes of manslaughter arising from traffic fatalities in 1964. Both cases are awaiting trial.

#### Dangerous Driving Causing Death.

(18) A total of 75 persons were charged with dangerous driving causing death in 1965, as compared with 83 persons charged in 1964. Convictions were recorded against 22 persons within the year and 24 cases are shown pending.

#### Dangerous Driving Causing Serious Bodily Harm.

(19) Sixty persons were charged with this offence during 1965 as compared with one hundred and two persons in 1964. Convictions were recorded against 21 persons and proceedings are shown pending against 19.

#### Group 11 - Offences Against Property with Violence.

- (20) Included in this group are offences of Burglary, Housebreaking and related offences, Robbery and Malicious Injury to Property.
- (21) The number of effences recorded in this group in 1965 was 4,213 as compared with 4,282 in 1964, a decrease of 69.

#### Burglary and Housebreaking.

- (23) The number of offences of Burglary, Housebreaking and related offences (including attempts to break into premises and possession of housebreaking implements) recorded in 1965 was 3992 as compared with 4085 in 1964. Proceedings were instituted in 2762 cases in 1965 and in an additional 254 cases the offenders were detected but no proceedings are shown giving a total of 3016 detections or 75%. The percentage in 1964 was 73%.
- (24) The following table shows the numbers of Burglaries, Housebreakings and related offences recorded in the years 1960 to 1965, inclusive:-

#### Robbery.

(25) Seventy seven offences of robbery and assaults with intent to rob were recorded in 1965, as compared with sixty two offences in 1964. Proceedings were instituted in 58 cases. Convictions were recorded in 47 cases for the year and in a further five cases the probation of Offenders Act was applied.

Five cases are shown still pending. Firearms were alleged to have been used in 3 cases, brief particulars of which are given in Appendix "E" together with particulars of some other cases.

#### Arson and other Malicious Injury to Property.

(26) One hundred and forty three offences under this heading were recorded in 1965, of which 58 were offences of Arson. In 1964 the total of offences was 127, of which 45 were offences of Arson. Proceedings were instituted in 83 cases in 1965 and in a further 17 cases the offenders were detected but no proceedings were taken.

# Group 111 - Offences Against Property Without Violence.

- (27) Included in this group are offences of larceny, Embezzlement, Obtaining Goods, etc., by False Pretences, Frauds and Receiving Stolen Goods.
- (28) The number of offences recorded in the group in 1965 was 11,014 as compared with 11,972 in 1964.
- (29) Proceedings were instituted in 6,288 cases and in an additional 872 cases the offenders were detected but no proceedings were taken. The total of detections, therefore, was 7160 or 65%. The detection percentage in 1964 was 57%. Convictions were recorded in 3428 cases in 1965 and in an additional 2132 cases the probation of Offenders Act was applied 802 cases are shown pending.

<sup>(32)</sup> Of the total larcenies recorded in 1965, 6160 or 60% were recorded in the Dublin Metropolitan Area, as compared with almost 66% in 196 $l_{*}$ .

#### Embezzlement.

(33) Thirty seven offences of embezzlement were recorded in 1965, as compared with 71 in 1964. Proceedings were instituted in 35 cases and in an additional two cases the offenders were detected but no proceedings are shown.

#### Obtaining Goods etc. by False Pretences.

(34) Four hundred and seventy four offences under this heading were recorded in 1965, as compared with 381 in 1964. Proceedings were instituted in 385 cases and in an additional 32 cases the offenders were detected but no proceedings are shown.

#### Frauds.

(35) Seventy seven frauds were recorded in 1965, as compared with 87 in 1964. Proceedings were instituted in 74 cases and in one additional case the offenders were detected but no proceedings are shown.

#### Receiving Stolen Goods.

(36) Two hundred and eighty six offences under this heading were recorded in 1965, as compared with 283 in 1964. Proceedings were taken in 274 cases and an additional 11 cases were detected but no proceedings are shown.

#### Group IV - Other Indictable Offences.

- (37) Included in this group are offences of Forgery and Uttering, Perjury, Bribery, Riot and Unlawful Assembly. Offences against the Coinage Acts, Offences against Public Decency, Attempting to Commit Suicide, Offences against the Treason Act and the Offences against the State Act and other indictable offences not included in Group 1, 11 or 111.
- (38) The total of offences recorded in the group in 1965 was 396 of which 314 were offences of Forgery and Uttering. In 1964 the number of offences was 401 of which 315 were offences of Forgery and Uttering. Proceedings were taken in 341 cases in 1965 and a further 24 cases were detected but no proceedings are shown.

#### Organised Crime of Violence.

(39) No organised crimes of violence were recorded in 1965, nor were any such crimes recorded in 1964,

#### Value of Property Stolen and Recovered.

- (40) The total value of property reported stolen in 1965 was £298,946 as compared with £386,806 in 1964. The value of property recovered in 1965 was £82,582 as compared with £83,121 in 1964.
- (41) In offences against property with violence, (i.e. Housebreakings) the value of property reported stolen in 1965 was £137,678 of which property valued £30,814 was recovered. In 1964 the value of property stolen was £126,693 of which property valued £33,550 was recovered.
- (42) In offences against property without violence (i.e. larcenies) the value of property reported stolen in 1965 was £161,268 of which property valued £51,768 was recovered and in 1964 was £260,113 of which £49,571 was recovered.

(43) The following table shows the age groups of persons found guilty of indictable offences, including persons against whom the charges were held proved and the Probation of Offenders Act applied, in the years 1960 to 1965, inclusive:-



# MURDER, INFANTICIDE, ATTEMPTS TO MURDER, THREATS ETC. TO MURDER AND MANSLAUGHTER.

## PARTICULARS OF CASES.

# Murder - (of persons aged above 1 year) - Seven cases

## Dublin Metropolitan Area.

On 24th October, 1964, a ten years old schoolboy was assaulted and received a blow of a piece of timber on the head which caused his death. An arrest was made and a 13 years old boy was charged with murder. He was later committed to a Mental Hospital.

## Dublin Metropolitan Area.

On 1st March, 1965, an unmarried female student died as a result of an attempt to procure an abortion. An arrest was made and a 26 years old male student was charged with murder. At the Central Criminal Court on 25th October, 1965, the accused was found "Not Guilty" and was discharged.

#### Dublin Metropolitan Area.

On 21st May, 1965, in the course of a row which developed in the "Read Room" at North Wall Extension, a 28 years old unmarried Dock worker, received a stab wound which resulted in his death. The weapon used was a knife. Six Dockers were arrested and charged with murder. At the Central Criminal Court on 22nd November, 1965, the case against two of the accused was withdrawn from the Jury and they were discharged. On 27th November, 1965, the Jury disagreed in the case against the other four men. No date has yet been fixed for the holding of a new trial.

#### Co. Meath.

ç; .

On 2nd January, 1965, a 76 years old retired labourer was attacked in his home by his nephew, a 53 years old labourer, who struck him on the head several times with a hatchet inflicting fatal injuries. The offender was charged with murder. At the Central Criminal Court he was found to be insane and incapable of pleading and was ordered to be detained in the Central Mental Hospital.

#### Co. Louth.

On 6th March, 1965, the dead body of a  $18\frac{1}{2}$  years old unmarried female was found in a shallow stream about a mile from her home. A number of large stones were lying on the body. A 21 years old labourer was arrested and charged with murder. At the Central Criminal Court on 5th July, 1965, the accused was found "Guilty" of murder and sentenced to Penal Servitude for life. An appeal was lodged.

#### Co. Roscommon.

On 25th July, 1965, a 19 years old unmarried girl was shot dead from behind on her way home from Mass. The weapon used was a shotgun. The dead body of her assailant, a 49 years old unmarried farmer, was found nearby. He had died from a self inflicted gunshot wound.

#### Co. Waterford.

On 25th January, 1965, the dead body of a 35 years old married C.1.E. worker was found in a laneway near his home. The body bore stab wounds. A 24 years old married tradesman was arrested and charged with murder. At the Central Criminal Court on 30th June, 1965, the accused was found "Guilty" of murder and sentenced to Penal Servitude for life. Leave to appeal was refused.

#### ATTEMPT TO MURDER - 1 Case.

#### Co. Kilkenny.

On 24th March, 1965, a 32 years old female nurse was stabbed in the back while she was out walking with a friend. Her assailant a 25 years old unmarried itinerant labourer was arrested and charged with attempted murder. At the Central Criminal Court the accused was found to be insane and incapable of pleading and was ordered to be detained in the Central Mental Hospital.

#### Manslaughter (other than traffic fatalities) - 5 cases.

#### Co. Kildare.

On 21st June, 1965, at the conclusion of a dance held in a marquee sited in a field, a 19 years old farmer's son was electrocuted when endeavouring to climb over an eight strand barbed wire fence. A 25 years old unmarried labourer employed as temporary caretaker of the marquee admitted wiring the fence to the electric lighting system of the marquee to prevent persons gaining access to the marquee without payment. He was arrested and charged and has been sent for trial.

#### Co. Kilkenny.

On 28th August, 1965, a 41 years old itinerant was shot and fatally wounded in the course of a dispute with two farmer's sons concerning the trespass of horses. The weapon used was a shotgun. The offenders were arrested and charged with murder. At the Central Criminal Court on 15th December, 1965, both the accused were found "Not Guilty" of murder but "Guilty" of manslaughter. A sentence of 2 years imprisorment was imposed on both accused.

#### Co. Tipperary.

On 14th February, 1965, following an altercation on the public street a 29th years old floor sander was assaulted and knocked to the ground by a 70 years old publican. His head struck a wall and he sustained injuries from which he died on the following day. His assailant was arrested and charged with manslaughter. At the Circuit Court in Nenagh he was found "Not Guilty" and discharged.

#### Co. Louth.

On 21st April, 1965, a  $6\frac{1}{2}$  years old schoolboy was admitted to Louth County Hospital in an unconscious condition, suffering from multiple injuries. He died the following day without regaining consciousness. A  $16\frac{1}{2}$  years old boy was charged with murder. At the Central Criminal Court on 21st July, 1965, the accused was found "Not Guilty" of murder but "Guilty" of manslaughter and sentenced to  $\frac{1}{4}$  years detention in St. Patricks Institution. Leave to appeal was refused.

#### Cc. Offaly.

On 19th January, 1965, the dead body of a 65 years old widow who lived alone was found on the kitchen floor of her home. The head and face bore extensive injuries. A 17 year old youth was arrested and charged with murder. At the Central Criminal Court on 13th July, 1965, the accused pleaded "Not Guilty" to murder but "Guilty" to manslaughter. He was convicted of manslaughter and sentenced to 7 years detention in St. Patricks Institution.

#### ROBBERY.

# ROBBERIES WITH FIREARMS AND OTHER SERIOUS ROBBERIES.

#### Dublin Metropolitan Area.

- (1) On 28th June, 1965, two schoolboys were accosted by two youths. One of the youths pointed an air rifle and discharged a pellet which struck and penetrated a collection box containing 4/= which one of the schoolboys was carrying. The youths took the box and extracted the contents. The offenders were arrested. One was sentenced to two years in Reformatory and the other was placed on Probation for two years.
- (2) On 12th March, 1965, during the absence from home of a 35 years old dealer, a man called to the house and was admitted by a 15 years old boy who was in the house at the time. The intruder pushed the boy into the kitchen and produced a weapon resembling a pistol. He demanded money and having got £155. 18. Od, he made off. No one has been made amenable.

#### Co. Meath.

(1) On 25th March, 1965, two masked men entered a Sub Post Office. One of them had a small gun in his hand. He presented the gun and there was an explosion and sparks from it. The second man went behind the counter and took about £66 in notes from a drawer. Both men then made away in a car. Two persons aged 23 years and 18 years were arrested and charged with this crime. One of them was sentenced to 18 months imprisonment and the other to 12 months in St. Patricks Institution. The gun used was subsequently identified as a sports starting pistol.

#### Other Robberies.

#### Dublin Metropolitan Area.

- (1) On 4th February, 1965, a pay car containing cash amounting to £7,600 was rammed and forced to stop by another car. Five men, four of them wearing masks, jumped out of the second car and forced open the boot of the pay car with jemmies. One of the men was carrying what appeared to be a pick axe and he prevented the occupants of the pay car from taking any action. The men made away with the money in a waiting car. Five persons were arrested and charged. Two were sentenced to three years penal servitude and one to two years imprisonment. The case against the remaining accused persons has not yet been disposed of.
- (2) On 18th July, 1965, a 40 years old taxi driver was assaulted and the sum of £4 taken from him by three youths. He was then taken to a building site near-by where his hands were tied behind his back. A plank 5' long was put between his arms and his back. Two youths were arrested in this case and both were sentenced to 8 months detention in St. Patricks Institution. The third youth involved has not yet been made amenable.

#### Co. Limerick.

(1) On the night of 7th/8th April, 1965, the home of a 76 years old widow, who lived alone, was entered by a man who demanded money. On being refused the intruder attacked the woman and indecently assaulted her. He then left taking with him a transistor radio value £18. A 20½ years old labourer was arrested and charged in this case. He was sentenced to seven years penal servitude. An appeal has been lodged.
